

Delivery System Reform Incentive Program (DSRIP) Update
Stakeholders Advisory Committee (SAC) Meeting

DSRIP

Pursuant to California’s Section 1115 Medicaid “Bridge to Reform Waiver”, the Delivery System Reform Incentive Program (DSRIP) is a federal pay-for-performance initiative that provides supplemental federal funding of up to \$3.3 billion over 5 years to promote public hospital delivery system transformation.

Their five year plans cover four inter-related areas of quality improvement: Infrastructure Development, Innovation and Redesign, Population-focused Improvement and Urgent Improvement in Care. Seventeen Designated Public Hospitals (DPH) are currently participating in DSRIP and 46 Non-Designated Public Hospitals (NDPH) are awaiting Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approval of the NDPH DSRIP application to begin the DSRIP plan approval process.

DPH Performance-Under Categories 1 and 2, DPHs have worked on primary care staffing, developing and enhancing medical home models, implementing or expanding electronic health records and improving access by opening new clinics. All hospitals have met virtually all of their performance milestones to date.

As DSRIP-DPH moves forward with Categories 3 and 4, the DPHs will enhance their capacity to collect and monitor chronic disease management data and will advance patient safety through a series of evidence-based, quality improvement programs.

Category 4 Plan Modifications- DPHs have submitted modifications for Category 4, Urgent Improvement in Care. These are currently under CMS review.

*Category 5-HIV Transition Projects-*Approved by CMS in June 2012 as an amendment to the 1115 Waiver, Category 5 establishes additional DSRIP projects that support the transition of Low Income Health Program (LIHP) enrollees with HIV. Category 5 Plan Modifications for DPHs have been submitted to CMS for approval. All but one have currently been approved.

*DY 7 Annual Report-*Each DPH has submitted their Annual Report for DY 7. Reports are currently under review by DHCS.

DSRIP-Non-Designated Public Hospitals (NDPH)-The NDPH DSRIP Program is pending CMS approval. Hospitals have begun initial development of individual hospital plans for Categories 1 (Infrastructure Development) and 2 (Innovation and Redesign), in preparation for the plan approval

process. DHCS remains connected with the hospitals and their representative entity, the District Hospital Leadership Forum (DHLF), through weekly meetings in an effort to maintain process and coordination.
