SUBJECT: COUNTYWIDE AVERAGES FOR FISCAL YEAR (FY) 2000-2001

This transmittal is being sent to amend the fiscal year dates mentioned in the previous copy of PPL 00-005 dated March 7, 2000.

The purpose of this transmittal is to provide all Local Governmental Agencies (LGAs) participating in the Medi-Cal Administrative Activities (MAA) program with the enclosed listing, "**County Population, Medi-Cal Eligibles, and Medi-Cal Eligibles as a Percent of the Population, FY 1998-1999.**" The listing, commonly referred to as the countywide average, includes Medi-Cal Eligibles that have a Share of Cost.

Pursuant to Policy and Procedure Letter No. 96-015, dated August 1, 1996, regarding "Standardized Format, Descriptions, and Instructions for Preparing the MAA Claiming Plan," the countywide average is one of the two approved discounting methods for determining the Medi-Cal percentage. As described in the MAA claiming plan, the countywide average must be used by the LGA, that has selected this method to discount costs, on the MAA invoice for FY 2000-2001. The City of Pasadena, City of Berkeley, and the City of Long Beach will use their respective county's average.
