Listed below are EWC activities for the Fourth Quarter of FY 2014-15:

June 11, 2015: EWC held a joint DHCS Breast and Cervical Cancer Advisory Council and key stakeholder meeting as part of the **2015 Every Woman Counts Breast and Cervical Cancer Symposium**. Agenda items comprised of the changing roles of EWC, and creating opportunities in light of recently released Center for Disease Control and Prevention recently released policies that address breast, and cervical cancer screening. Small group roundtable discussions were offered followed by a larger group discussion. EWC changed the typical format for this meeting to include a guided discussion of EWC program priorities.

June 11-12, 2015: Program presented the EWC Breast and Cervical Cancer Symposium in Sacramento, at the Holiday Inn Downtown Plaza. The symposium was well attended, and consisted of presentations by cancer survivors, doctors, health educators and other breast and cervical cancer screening professionals from locations throughout California. The two day symposium included both screening and diagnosis, and education and risk tracks. Topics included; breast density, breast cancer prevention and risk, imaging in breast screening and diagnosis, communicating risk to the public, cervical cancer vaccines, current landscape and pathways to improvement and disparities in breast and cervical cancer screening, diagnostics and treatment.

⁴ Case management is paid at \$0 for normal screening results and \$50 for abnormal screening results. The policy for \$0/\$50 has been implemented in the claims payment system.

⁵ Includes cervical screening and diagnostic services, and pathology procedures for both breast and cervical cancer screening program.
