The purpose of this information notice is to provide additional implementation instructions and follow-up on the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) of 1993. The Department of Mental Health conducted a survey of all counties and their contract providers to determine compliance efforts. The results of that survey indicate that although counties are in substantial compliance, there are areas in which improvement can be made. It is very important that these concerns be addressed both within the county and to all contract providers.

Not all counties and contract providers are properly storing copies of voter registration forms and/or declination forms. Copies of these forms should be retained as the state is required to report to the federal court for approximately two more years regarding efforts in registering voters. Thus, these forms should be available in order to determine actual counts for future surveys. Some counties and contractors have indicated that the files are kept in the client's confidential files. Voter registration forms or declination forms should not be kept in these files, but in a separate file that is available should the department require additional information for the courts.

In addition, some counties and contractors have indicated that they batch and send forms to the local registrar of voters on a quarterly basis. This is not sufficient. Voter registration forms should be sent to the registrar of voters at a minimum on a weekly basis.

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It is important that counties and contractors adhere to the information contained in the DMH Information Notices No. 95-19 and No. 96-03 issued previously, as well as this notice.
