Presentation Overview:</b></p> <p>a. <b>SUD Presentation:</b> This presentation will focus on the theme of cultural competence. We will highlight a few alcohol and other drug (AOD) research/data analyses based findings from the recently drafted Statewide Needs Assessment and Planning (SNAP) Report. We will then shift to shift to race/ethnic focused findings from the National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH), and from DHCS’ California Outcome Measurement System for Treatment (CalOMS TX) data analyses including persons served, and program performance and client outcome measures.</p> <p>b. <b>POS Presentation:</b> This presentation will examine emerging trends in initial POS reports data with a focus on penetration rates by different demographic characteristics for quality improvement purposes based on data from the statewide report and the population-based county grouping reports. We will highlight how the two reports on this population provide different but meaningful information that can be used for Quality Improvement purposes.</p> <p><b>II. Presentation:</b> Today’s presentation will highlight the Alternative Federal Payment Methodology Pilot Study for MHPs. DHCS will have options for the design of state and county financing mechanisms; for example, continued fee-for-service, capitation, pay-for-performance, or other models. A similar range of options will be available for local-level provider reimbursement – per-member per-month, case rate or other bundled reimbursement, pay for performance, and other methods.
