# **Medi-Cal Promoting Interoperability Program**

# 2019 Stage 3: Tips for Dental Providers

### **General Program and Participation Requirements**

In 2019, providers will only be able to attest to Stage 3. All providers are required to use 2015 Edition certified electronic health record technology.

#### **Eligibility Requirements**

- Be a licensed dentist in the State of California.
- Have 30% or more patient volume attributable to Medi-Cal patients in a 90-day period in the preceding calendar year.
- Participation in the Medi-Cal Promoting Interoperability Program, formerly known as the Medi-Cal Electronic Health Record Incentive Program, prior to 2017.
- Program year participation does not need to be in consecutive years.

## Meaningful Use

- A dentist can receive \$8,500 per year by demonstrating meaningful use.
- To date, only 9% of dentists in the program have taken advantage of available meaningful use funds.
- It's not as hard as you think! Dentists can utilize many tips and work-arounds, including using exclusions, to attain meaningful use.

Coordination of Care through Patient Engagement	<ul> <li>Use certified electronic health record technology to engage with patients or the authorized representative about the patient's care.</li> </ul>
Health Information Exchange	<ul> <li>Exclusion for less than 100 transitions of care during the EHR reporting period.</li> <li>Applicable when patients are referred for additional dental services.</li> </ul>
Public Health and Clinical Data Registry Reporting	<ul> <li>Exclusions available if a dentist does not:</li> <li>Administer immunizations,</li> <li>Practice in county with syndromic surveillance,</li> <li>Treat or diagnose any diseases reportable to their jurisdiction's reportable disease system,</li> <li>Diagnose or directly treat any disease associated with a public health registry,</li> <li>Treat or diagnose any disease or condition associated with a clinical data registry.</li> </ul>

### **Clinical Quality Measures**

For 2019, providers are required to report on any six clinical quality measures (CQMs) related to the scope of practice. Providers are also required to report on at least one outcome measure. If none of the outcome measures are relevant, the provider must report on at least one high-priority measure. For dentists, DHCS has designated CMS 74: Primary Caries Prevention as a high priority CQM. The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) designated CMS 75: Children Who Have Dental Decay as an outcome measure.
