Welcome and Introductions:

Walter welcomed the committee members and staff present. He asked the committee present to introduce themselves. It was announced that a quorum was established.

Review and Approve June meeting minutes:

Motion to approve January 19, 2017 minutes by Susan W., seconded by Noel O. Minutes unanimously approved.

<u>Data Notebook (DNB) 2016: Development of Theme/Topic for Next DNB for</u> 2017:

Susan mentioned that the DNB was released to the counties and UC Berkeley in December 2016. She asked the committee to pick a topic for the 2017 DNB.

Linda suggested we could explore older adults as the new topic for the DNB. A few suggestions were briefly raised by committee members.

Noel said the older adults' topic is a good option to explore. We could address the issues and culture of that population.

Raja mentioned that we could learn how different cultures view older adults. Some cultures appreciate older people because they are wise, honorable, and have life experiences.

The committee voted unanimously that the new 2017 DNB topic is regarding older adults with an emphasis on cultural experience.

The committee members would like to change the name of this committee from CSI to Quality Improvement and Evaluation (QIE) committee.

Work Plan Review:

Work Plan Goal Number One:

Received data back from the counties.

Work Plan Goal Number Two:

Sack, Tom, and Lorraine were working on the LGBTQ white paper report around October and November of 2016. Sack forward the final draft to Lorraine because she would like to review it first before Sack passes the report to Jane.

Work Plan Goal Number Three:

The committee will focus on cultural differences in mental health pertaining to aging and substance use disorders and alcohol and other drugs.

The committee will identify best practices to treat behavioral health regarding the aging population and cultural differences.

Guest Presenter Patrick Foley:

Patrick Foley, who is the program manager for McAlister Institute, presented information on youth substance use disorder programs and services in San Diego County. McAlister serves youth between 12 to 18 years old. Majority of the youth who are in the program are males. They have on-site programs and mental health service counselors' available throughout most of the high schools in San Diego County. They also provide inpatient and outpatient services for individuals who need immediate service.

Patrick mentioned that Prevention Early Intervention (PEI) is important in increasing awareness. McAlister has established PEI curriculum as a learning tool for youth who are going through their program. Parents can attend the recovery process with their kids if they wish to.

Patrick has been working in this field for almost 14 years and believe that most youth who seek help from McAlister Institute have benefited.
