Subject: Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) County Expenditures

Title: Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) County Expenditures by Component During FY 2010-11

Authority/Mandate: Per Welfare and Institutions (W&I) Code Section 5899 the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is responsible for developing and administering the Annual MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report. DHCS is providing this expenditure information consistent with the requirements set forth in W&I Code Section 5899 (b)(1).

Overview: This report of MHSA County Expenditures by Component during Fiscal Year (FY) 2010-11 was prepared by DHCS. The expenditure information was taken from each county's FY 2010-11 Annual MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report. Each County Auditor Controller is responsible for certifying the MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report prior to submission to DHCS.

This report reflects net MHSA program expenditures made during FY 2010-11 by county. Total mental health program expenditures are higher as they include additional funding sources such as Federal Financial Participation, 1991 Realignment, County General Funds, grants, patient fees, insurance, and/or Medicare.
