The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), Systems of Care Division (SCD) and the California Department of Public Health, Maternal, Child, Adolescent Health (CDPH/MCAH) Program are pleased to release the 2017 Title V Application Public Report and Appendix to the Title V 2015 Application/Report for MCAH Block Grant funding. The Title V Program serves children with special health care needs enrolled in the DHCS CCS Program, as well as all pregnant women, mothers, infants, children, and adolescents.

Each year, the DHCS/SCD and the CDPH/MCAH complete an extensive report and application in compliance with Title V of the Social Security Act. The Application/Report contains a five-page Executive Summary highlighting the program activities and successes.

6. Cross-Cutting/Life Course.
