

SUBJECT: SODIUM CHLORIDE 0.9% (NORMAL SALINE) FLUSH SYRINGE

PRODUCTS BECOME A MEDICAL SUPPLY BENEFIT EFFECTIVE

AUGUST 1, 2016

The purpose of this information notice is to communicate that effective August 1, 2016, the Medi-Cal Program (including the CCS Program and GHPP) will reclassify sodium chloride 0.9% (normal saline) syringe flushes to be a medical supply benefit item, instead of a drug benefit product. The change is due to the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) classifying these products to be Class II medical devices, intended to be used only for the flushing of indwelling vascular access devices. These products will continue to be billable by the product's 11-digit Medi-Cal billing number.

In the Children's Medical Services Network (CMS Net), medical supplies billable by an 11-digit code require a separate authorization. Similar to heparin flushes, diabetic test strips, lancet, and insulin syringe/needles, normal saline syringe flushes will now require separate authorization.

Pharmacy providers can no longer claim for normal saline syringe flush products with a Service Code Grouping (SCG) Service Authorization Request (SAR).
