

ADDITIONAL DETAILS RELATING TO CERTAIN SYSTEMS/REPORTS

Client and Services Information (CSI) System

The Department of Mental Health's (DMH) Client and Services Information (CSI) System collects data pertaining to mental health clients and the services they receive at the county level. This data is processed and stored at DMH. Counties send a CSI submission file to DMH monthly. It includes demographics, dates and types of services, diagnoses and periodic data about clients receiving services. Much of the information collected is used for Federal Block Grant reporting and for other statistical reporting as requested by external entities such as the State Legislature.

Data Collection and Reporting (DCR) System

Information collected by counties at intake and includes data about the status of the individual in the 12 months prior to enrollment, for persons enrolled in a MHSA-funded Full Service Partnership program. Counties have the option of submitting the data via the DCR or in batch using XML (extensible mark-up language). Counties are required to submit this data within 60 days of collection. Information is collected over time as changes occur in the following domains: Partnership Status, Housing, Employment, Education, Criminal Justice, Other Legal Statuses such as Foster Care, and Co-Occurring Substance Abuse.

County Quarterly Reports

Information about the number of people who are receiving services funded through MHSA. Can get Actual & Target counts downloaded from SQL database into Excel spreadsheets.

Involuntary Detention (ID) Quarterly Reporting

WIC Section 5402(a) requires the State Department of Mental Health (DMH) to collect quantitative data concerning the number of persons admitted and treated involuntarily under several sections of the WIC. Furthermore, DMH is also required to collect data on the number of persons transferred to mental health facilities pursuant to Sections 4011.6 or 4011.8 of the Penal Code, the number of persons for whom temporary conservatorships are established, and the number of persons for whom conservatorships are established in each county.

Medi-Cal Trend Report

A statistical report that provides data on specialty mental health services funded through the Medi-Cal program. Included in the report are data on eligibility, utilization, treatment expenditures, and penetration rate. The report contains statewide, regional, and county data, which are presented across a number of programmatic and demographic variables including aid group, age group and gender, race/ethnicity, and type of service.

Cultural Competence Population Assessment

Demographic data for M/C beneficiaries and clients served. It includes race/ethnicity, age, language, SSA status, service type, and diagnosis. The data is posted on ITWS for counties to use in their annual Cultural Competence Plan.

Threshold Languages Report

Languages preferred by 3,000 M/C beneficiaries or 5% of the M/C beneficiary population by county. The threshold language report(s) show the number of beneficiaries by county and language and those languages that are considered to be threshold languages for each county. Counties are required to provide access to services through them.
