DHCS UPDATES

1. Policy Updates

- Update: Inpatient Claims for Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives

Effective for dates of service on or after July 1, 2015, general acute care hospitals as defined in Section 1250 of the Health & Safety Code may submit claims for the long-acting reversible contraceptive methods on an outpatient claim, even when treatment is provided on an inpatient basis

2. ICD-10

- On June 1, 2015, DHCS posted Draft ICD-10 Code manual sections. These draft manual sections can be downloaded from the ICD-10 page of the Medi-Cal website. The Draft ICD-10 Code Release manual sections are not the final policy and may be subject to change.

The final policy changes from the implementation to ICD-10 will be published in future Medi-Cal and Family PACT Updates.



- In late July, Medi-Cal began conducting ICD-10 end-to-end testing with Medi-Cal stakeholders. Selection of test partners from a representative, broad cross-section of provider types, claim types and submitter types.

3. Administrative Updates

- On August 5, 2015, OIG released audit report entitled “California Improperly Claimed Enhanced Federal Reimbursement for Medicaid Family Planning Drugs Provided in Orange County”

- Effective July 1, 2015, the responsibility for Medi-Cal family planning policy development has transitioned to the Office of Family Planning.
- On July 2, 2015, DHCS submitted a grant application in response to the Adult Medicaid Quality: Improving Maternal and Infant Health Outcomes in Medicaid and CHIP funding opportunity (CMS-1F1-15-001)
 - OFP is the principal contact
 - Collect and report data to CMS on a new developmental quality measure to assess contraceptive use in women and thus, further assist states in efforts to improve perinatal health outcomes
 - 4-year grant (September 2, 2015 – September 1, 2019)



4. Upcoming Policy Updates

- Client eligibility determination policy is being updated to:
 - Convert to using Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) counting rules for eligibility determination for Family PACT in order to comply with the Affordable Care Act and
 - Clarify the policy regarding other health coverage and confidentiality.
- Provider Enrollment
