Partners for Children (PFC) is a program for children with special health care needs that are life-threatening.

WHAT IS PALLIATIVE CARE?

Palliative care provides comfort care for children and families.

Palliative care focuses on:

- improving quality of life
- pain and symptom management
- providing emotional support

The Partners For Children (PFC) program provides supportive comfort services, including care coordination and pain management that will help support your child through the illness as you continue to seek ongoing treatment for your child.



WHAT SERVICES ARE OFFERED?

- ❖ Care Coordination
- ❖ Pain and Symptom Management
- ❖ 24/7 On-call Nursing Support
- ❖ Expressive Therapies such as creative art, music, massage and play therapy
- ❖ Family Training including: education and training on palliative care issues, care needs, treatments, and use of equipment
- ❖ Respite Care
- ❖ Support Counseling for your child and family, including bereavement if needed.

These services are in addition to those provided by Medi-Cal and CCS.

IS MY CHILD ELIGIBLE?

A child needs to meet all of the following:

- ❖ Live in a county that is participating in the program
- ❖ Be eligible for full Medi-Cal benefits
- ❖ Be 20 years of age or younger
- ❖ Have an eligible condition



Here is a list of medical conditions that may qualify a child to receive services:

- Cancer
- Cystic Fibrosis
- Brain or head injuries
- Spinal muscular atrophy
- Muscular dystrophy dependent on a ventilator
- Intestinal problems and dependent on IV nutrition
- Liver or bowel transplant
- Heart defects or conditions
- Problems following a transplant
- Leukodystrophies



The Partners for Children waiver program provides support services for children with life-threatening health conditions. After review of the information received from your child's doctor or CCS Special Care Center doctor, we will work with you to determine if your child is eligible for the program.
