

# Milestones Calendar as of February 2022

#### **CONTEXT:**

California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal, or CalAIM, is a transformational plan to modernize the State's Medicaid program. It will improve the quality of life and health outcomes of Medi-Cal enrollees, including those with the most complex health and social needs. CalAIM includes a series of far-reaching initiatives that together represent broad reforms of Medi-Cal's programs and systems. The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is implementing CalAIM in partnership with Medi-Cal providers, Managed Care Plans (MCPs), Counties, Community-Based Organizations and other stakeholders. These changes will span a multi-year period, with the first reforms already underway effective January 1, 2022 and subsequent reforms to be phased in through 2027.1

This CalAIM Milestones Calendar is a dynamic document that reflects DHCS' expected timing of upcoming milestones through the second quarter of 2022 for CalAIM and key related initiatives. In some instances, program launch dates are contingent upon timely Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) approval. Because dates may shift as policies are finalized, the document will be updated regularly to reflect any changes. Stakeholders are encouraged to check the <a href="DHCS CalAIM website">DHCS CalAIM website</a> for updates to ensure access to the most up-to-date information.
