- SUBJECT: CalAIM Behavioral Health Payment Reform Allocation
- PURPOSE: This Behavioral Health Information Notice informs Mental Health Plans, Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Counties, and Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Counties of Special Fund 3420 and the State General Funds allocated to counties to support the transition from Certified Public Expenditures (CPE) to Intergovernmental Transfers (IGTs) under CalAIM's Behavioral Heath Payment Reform Initiative.

BACKGROUND:

Welfare and Institutions Code, Section 14184.403 requires DHCS to implement Behavioral Health Payment Reform no sooner than July 1, 2022. Behavioral Health Payment Reform includes transitioning from a cost-based reimbursement methodology to an IGT-based reimbursement methodology that uses prospective reimbursement rates for Medi-Cal Specialty Mental Health Services (SMHS), DMC Services, and DMC-ODS Services. Before behavioral health payment reform, counties were reimbursed for these programs through the interim rate payment process according to Medicaid CPE methodologies. The county reimbursements were then later reconciled through cost settlements.

POLICY:

DHCS implemented an IGT process on July 1, 2023 pursuant to BHIN 23-026. With the IGT process, counties will need to transfer the county portion of their submitted claims to draw down matching Federal Financial Participation for payments. The State Controller's Office has established a new Special Fund for the IGT process, titled the Medi-Cal County Behavioral Health Fund, or Special Fund 3420.

To address counties' cash flow concerns, the California Legislature appropriated \$250,000,000 one-time in State General Funds to utilize as the non-federal match of claims. These funds will be used as the non-federal share for direct service payments until the funds have been fully liquidated. Once the funds have been liquidated for a delivery system, counties funds will be used as the non-federal match. To ensure that county claims can paid without a delay, Counties should begin transferring county funds to the state, pursuant to BHIN 23-026, prior to September 1, 2023.

The Enclosure details the amounts allocated to each county for DMC, DMC-ODS and SMHS. DHCS determined the allocation using each county's percentage of actual submitted claims from 2019 to 2022.
