Who Should Attend This Webinar

- This webinar will cover the process for reporting on funds received from the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy from NOAT II.
- » Cities and counties are required to complete DHCS expenditure reporting for Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy funds only if they received these funds directly from NOAT II.
- » If cities and counties opted out of direct payment for the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy from NOAT II, **they do not need to complete reporting**.
- » If you have questions about your city or county's status, contact your city or county counsel, or outside counsel handling opioid-related matters.

Background on the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy

Status of the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy

- An initial bankruptcy agreement with Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals was reached in February 2022. Bankruptcy funds are managed by a National Opioid Abatement Trust II (NOAT II).
- On August 28, 2023, Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals announced a second bankruptcy filing, which was approved on October 10, 2023.
 - Before the second filing, Mallinckrodt Pharmaceuticals made a one-time payment of \$250M to the Master Distribution Trust II (MDT II).
 - California is expected to receive over nine percent (9.9%) of the \$250M.

Funding Allocation Structure

The division of funds within California is governed by the <u>California</u> <u>Statewide Abatement Agreement</u>.

Fund Type	Allocation	Funds Received (as of March 2023)
Local Government Share (60%)	Allocated to all participating cities and counties.	\$9,028,309.20
State Share (40%)	Allocated to the state of California.	\$6,018,881.00

Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Payments

- » A list of Mallinckrodt bankruptcy payments received by cities and counties is available on the DHCS OSF website.
 - The list is updated as of April 2023.
- Allocations for participating cities are automatically reallocated to their respective counties unless the city opts into direct payment from the Distributors Settlement.

DHCS Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Reporting

- The <u>Department of Health Care Services</u> (DHCS) is tasked with collecting annual expenditure reports from cities and counties receiving funds directly from NOAT II.
 - DHCS will use these reports to complete the State's Beneficiary Abatement Use Report to the NOAT II Trustees.
- » DHCS does not distribute payments to cities and counties.
 - Opioid bankruptcy payments come from the National Opioid Abatement Trust (NOAT) II Trustees.

Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Expenditure Requirements

Focus on Opioid Remediation

- The Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy follows the definition of opioid remediation as defined in the National Opioid Settlement Agreements.
- » Opioid remediation is defined as "care, treatment, and other programs and expenditures ... designed to:
 - a) address the misuse and abuse of opioid products,
 - b) treat or mitigate opioid use or related disorders, and
 - c) mitigate other alleged effects of, including on those injured as a result of, the opioid epidemic.

Exhibit 4 of the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Plan

- Funds must be used for <u>future</u> opioid remediation in one or more of the opioid remediation activities listed in <u>Exhibit 4</u> of the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Plan (same as <u>Exhibit E</u> of the National Opioid Settlement Agreements).
- Exhibit 4 is broken into Schedule A (Core Strategies) and Schedule B (Approved Uses). Schedule B is a longer list of many types of opioid remediation activities, while Schedule A is a shorter list of core strategies that should be prioritized.
 - No less than 95% of Mallinckrodt funds received must be used on Exhibit E/Exhibit 4
 opioid remediation activities.

Differences in Expenditure Requirements

» Opioid Settlements

- Funds must be used for <u>future</u> Opioid Remediation in one or more areas listed in Exhibit E of the National Opioid Settlement Agreements.
- No less than fifty percent (50%) of the funds received from the CA Abatement Accounts Fund in each calendar year must be used for one or more of the California High Impact Abatement Activities (HIAA).
- Administrative costs must not exceed actual costs or ten percent (10%) of the total allocation.

» Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy

- Funds must be used for <u>future</u> Opioid Remediation through one or more of the strategies listed in Exhibit 4 of the Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Plan.
- No HIAA expenditure requirement.
- Administrative costs must not exceed five percent (5%) of the total allocation.

Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy Expenditure Reporting Form

DHCS Expenditure Reporting Comparison

» Opioid Settlements

- Cities and counties shall only submit one (1) expenditure report annually for funds received from the opioid settlements.
- DHCS will prepare an annual written report regarding the use of funds from the settlements.
 - These reports will continue until all funds are fully expended and for one year thereafter.
 - These reports will be made publicly available on the DHCS web site.

» Mallinckrodt Bankruptcy

- Cities and counties shall only submit one (1) expenditure report annually for funds received from the bankruptcy.
- DHCS will compile local reports to complete the State's Beneficiary Abatement Use Report to the NOAT II Trustees.
 - These reports will continue until all funds are fully expended and for one year thereafter.

Submission Requirements

- » Local Governments shall only submit one (1) expenditure report annually for funds received from the settlements.
- » It is the Local Government's responsibility to collect all required information regarding the Mallinckrodt bankruptcy funds they have received and to compile it into a singular report. This <u>includes</u> information from contractors or subgrantees.
 - Do not send the expenditure reporting form to contractors or subgrantees to whom
 you may have awarded your opioid settlement funds.
- » Please note that the online form can only be completed by one (1) person.

A Note on Reallocations

- >> This section is intended to capture transfers between Local Governments that happened **after** NOAT II funds were dispersed.
 - Counties who receive redirected funds due to cities opting out of direct payment (i.e., funds reallocated **before** the NOAT II disbursement date) do not need to indicate these transfers.
- » If your city opted out of receiving funds, you do not need to report.

Section 3. Expenditures

Expand availability of treatment for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including all forms of MAT approved by the U.S. F.D.A.

Support and reimburse evidence-based services that adhere to the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) continuum of care for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions

Expand telehealth to increase access to treatment for OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions, including MAT, as well as counseling, psychiatric support, and other treatment and recovery support services

Improve oversight of Opioid Treatment Programs (OTPs) to assure evidence-based or evidenceinformed practices such as adequate methadone dosing and low threshold approaches to treatment

Support mobile intervention, treatment, and recovery services, offered by qualified professionals and service providers, such as peer recovery coaches, for persons with OUD and any co-occurring SUD/MH conditions and for persons who have experienced an opioid overdose

Provide treatment of trauma for individuals with OUD (e.g., violence, sexual assault, human trafficking, or adverse childhood experiences) and family members (e.g., surviving family members after an overdose or overdose fatality), and training of health care personnel to identify and address such trauma

Administrative Expenses

Section 4. Administrative Expenses

» No more than **five percent (5%)** of the NOAT II funds received by a Local Government may be used to fund expenses incurred in administering the distributions for the Approved Opioid Abatement Uses.

4. Administrative Expenses

Per Section 2 of the NOAT II Trust Distribution Procedures, qualifying expenditures may include reasonable related administrative expenses.

Administrative costs are defined as expenses incurred in administering the distributions for Approved Opioid Abatement Uses, including the process of selecting programs to receive distributions of bankruptcy funds for implementing those programs.
