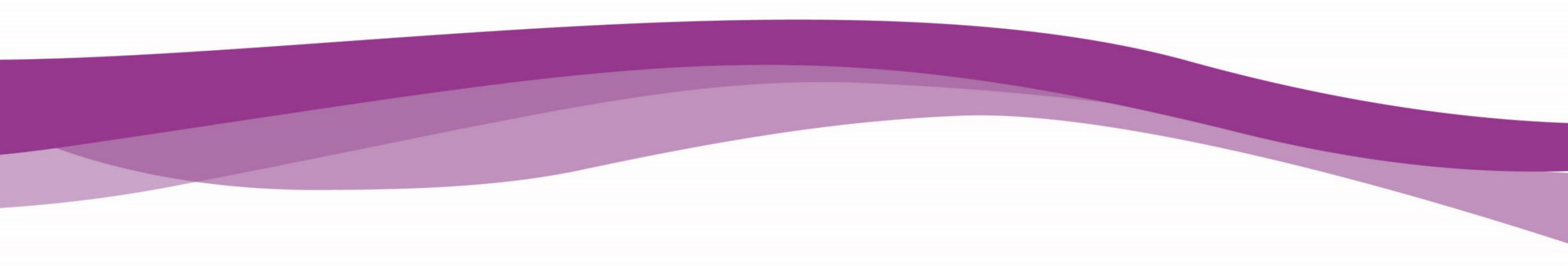
# Proposition 64 YEPEITA Round 4 Contracts

California Department of Public Health	\$12,000,000*
California Natural Resources Agency (CNRA)	\$17,626,000*
Total	<b>\$356,921,000*</b>

- *Less than 1 percent of all funds are retained by DHCS for operational expenditures and equipment; a majority of Proposition 64 funds are made available to communities through the Youth Substance Use Disorder Prevention Program opportunity.*
- *\*Round 4 amounts are based on the enacted budget and are subject to change.*

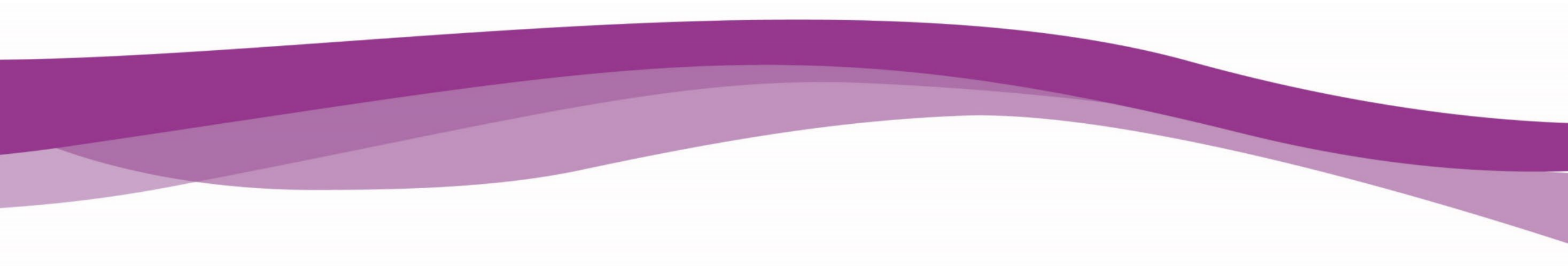

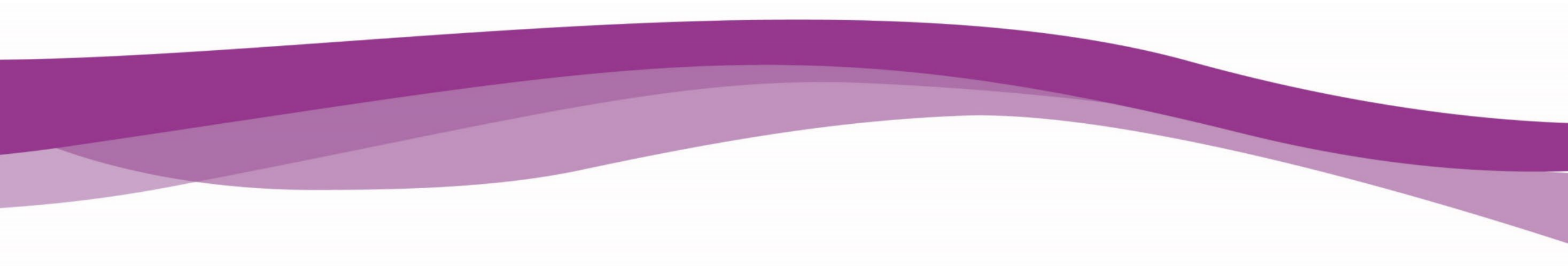

Request for Action (RFA) Type	Percentage of Contracted Amounts	Purpose of RFA	Recommended Changes
Standard Track	\$44 million	Peer support, mentoring, and youth social justice in communities impacted by the war on drugs.	
Innovation Track	\$8 million	Evaluation of Best Practice programs for EYC (county eligible).	
Capacity Track	\$8 million	Opportunity for emerging and grassroots organizations to build organizational capacity through funding and specialized technical assistance and training.

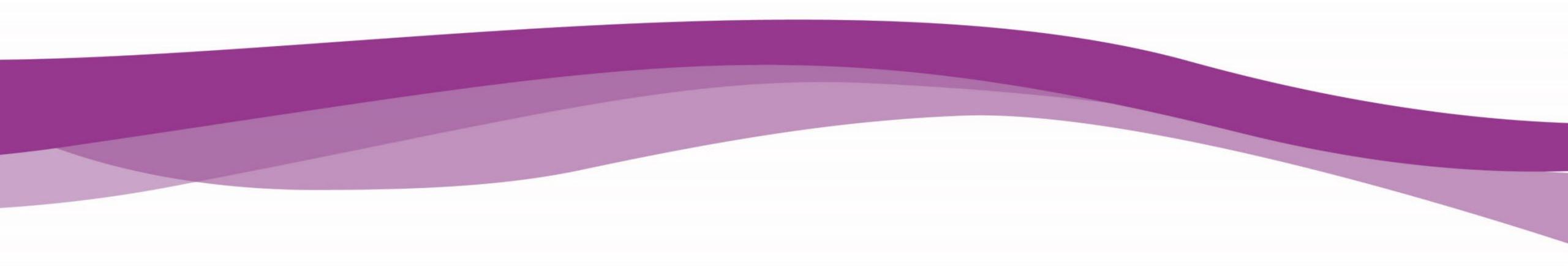
