Specialized non-profit organizations assistance was needed to provide housing navigation, and service connection support with drug addiction and mental health.

HIAA 3: Addressing the needs of communities of color and vulnerable populations (including sheltered and unsheltered homeless populations) that are disproportionately impacted by SUD Please describe:	Unsheltered vulnerable populations with the Corcoran community that is isolated with about a 20 mile distance from the Kings County seat and larger city of Hanford where most unsheltered services are provided

Additional Comments:

As a smaller rural city of approximately 22,500 (approximately 15,000 minus prison population) and remotely located, the City of Corcoran has limited funds and resources to devote towards address the community's most vulnerable population Although these

settlement funds are small and limited for our City, they provided a means to fund and support bringing additional supportive service connections to those who are and continue to be impacted by opioid and associated drug use.
