CalAIM Behavioral Health 2022 Technical Assistance and Training Overview

This technical assistance and training overview provides stakeholders information on the technical assistance and training opportunities taking place in 2022 related to the California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM) Behavioral Health initiatives. This plan includes an overview of the technical assistance activities led by DHCS with support from Aurrera Health Group and training offerings provided by California Mental Health Services Authority (CalMHSA). CalMHSA is a Joint Powers Authority (JPA) serving county public behavioral health plans that is focused on promoting efficiency, effectiveness and enterprise among California counties and cities. Technical assistance and trainings will be publically available for all stakeholders unless otherwise noted.

DHCS Technical Assistance

Behavioral Health CalAIM Inboxes

DHCS continually monitors and tracks questions that come in through the Behavioral Health (BH) CalAIM and BH Payment Reform inboxes. Throughout CalAIM implementation, DHCS will respond to individual questions and comments submitted to bhcalaim@dhcs.ca.gov and bhpaymentreform@dhcs.ca.gov.

Technical Assistance Webinars

DHCS will host technical assistance webinars focused on specific topics and led by DHCS subject matter experts. Some webinars will be devoted to reviewing the CalAIM policy guidance contained in Behavioral Health Information Notices as they are released. Other webinars will be responsive to stakeholder needs and feedback, focused on CalAIM implementation support and frequently asked questions (FAQs). These webinars will also be opportunities for stakeholders to ask DHCS questions.

FAQs/Fact Sheets

DHCS will develop written responses to questions raised by stakeholders. These written responses will inform FAQs or Fact Sheets that will be posted on the <u>Behavioral Health</u> <u>CalAIM Webpage</u>.

CalMHSA Trainings & Materials

Policy and Procedures

CalMHSA will develop policies and procedures that counties can adopt and adapt for use in the following categories: Access to SMHS; ASAM for DMC; DMC-ODS Policy Improvements; No Wrong Door /Co-Occurring Treatment; Clinical Documentation Requirements; Screening and Transition Tools.

Communication Materials

CalMHSA will share communication plans including staff and beneficiary communication materials. These materials are intended to be brief encapsulations of the CalAIM changes.

Documentation Guides

CalMHSA will produce role-specific documentation guides for Mental Health Plans (MHPs) and Drug Medi-Cal/Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC/DMC-ODS) plans to train county staff and contracted providers.

Office Hours

CalMHSA will be hosting weekly virtual office hours for interested stakeholders. Questions can be submitted in advance or asked during office hours.

Web-Based Documentation Training

CalMHSA will create web-based training videos to augment the documentation manuals. Training video topics will include an overview of CalAIM, Assessment, Access to SMHS/DMC/DMC-ODS, Diagnosis/Problem List, Care Coordination, Progress Notes, Discharge Planning.

<u>Transformation Webinars</u>

CalMHSA will hold a total of 10 transformation webinars April through June to dive deeper into operational areas impacted by CalAIM changes. These webinars are limited to county leadership and county quality improvement staff and will require advance registration.
