This document has been prepared on behalf of CalWIN, C-IV, and Leader for the RAND firm based on the request for data on 12/8/11.

California is one of 10 States selected to participate in a research project targeted at developing methodologies for calculation of the Federal Medical Assistance Percentages (FMAP) for the "newly eligible" population of Medicaid enrollees as required by the Affordable Care Act. The project will also include efforts to identify strategies for conversion to Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) when the Affordable Care Act eligibility changes take effect on January 1, 2014. The other participating States are: Arizona, Indiana, Nebraska, New Hampshire, New York, Oregon, Tennessee, Virginia, West Virginia.

RAND is leading the study in collaboration with the State Health Access Data Assistance Center (SHADAC) and the HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation (ASPE). Together with the States, the team will be evaluating and refining the three methodologies proposed by CMS (sampling, threshold and federal data) to make the MAGI approximations and to distinguish "newly eligible" from currently eligible individuals for the purposes of FMAP claiming. The purpose of the project is to develop these methodologies, assess their feasibility and create technical assistance materials that will be made available for the benefit all States.
