SENATE BILL 521 (AS AMENDED April 12, 2021) - OPPOSE

Dear Assemblymember Gonzalez:

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) must inform you of its opposition to Senate Bill (SB) 521. SB 521 would authorize DHCS to enter into value-based arrangements, including a rebate, discount, or price reduction, with drug manufacturers based on outcome data or other metrics, as determined by DHCS and the drug manufacturers. SB 521 would also require DHCS to report to the Legislature on or before July 1, 2022, on how value-based arrangements may be implemented in the Medi-Cal program.

More time is needed to evaluate the effectiveness of value-based arrangements and determine whether value-based arrangements are cost effective and appropriate in the long-term. While at first glance these types of arrangements may seem advantageous to the state by requiring drug manufacturers to be more fiscally responsible for treatment failures, the price of many of the new, innovative, and oftentimes genetic treatments that would fall under the scope of these types of contracts are listed in the million(s)-dollar range of up-front costs. Without broader use nationally, it is difficult to assess how successful the patient treatment outcomes are and whether that demonstrates a tangible value to the state for value-based arrangements.

Although SB 521 is permissive of these arrangements, it sets an expectation for DHCS to begin implementing these types of contracts by including a mandatory reporting date of July 1, 2022, to the Legislature, as to how these contracts may be implemented in the Medi-Cal program. In fact, DHCS already has the existing authority to negotiate the value-based arrangements proposed under this bill. If DHCS determines that it wants to move in this direction, a State Plan Amendment approval from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services would be required.
