

## **Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System Waiver Update**

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is seeking an 1115 Demonstration Waiver for the Substance Use Disorder Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) Program. The overall purpose of the Waiver is to create a model that will provide an Organized Delivery System of Substance Use Disorder (SUD) services. This Waiver will be an amendment to California's existing section 1115 Bridge to Reform Waiver.

In October 2014, DHCS released a second draft of the Special Terms and Conditions. On November 3, 2014, DHCS held a Waiver Advisory Group to discuss with stakeholders the proposed financial provisions of the waiver. The topics discussed included the budget neutrality, shared financing model, readiness assessment and implementation plan.
