Summary of Evidence

Yorkshire House provides services in a campus style setting with several buildings. Individuals who need memory care support live in Building A and B. Building A and B are licensed as a secure setting that is surrounded by fencing that is locked and alarmed. Individuals who live in Building A and B are restricted to that part of the campus and cannot access the Assisted Living Building. There are locked gates through the campus. Individuals receiving memory care services are not allowed to go into the community. Yorkshire House does not schedule community activities for individuals who are receiving memory care services. Individuals in the memory care unit are not supported to participate in community activities with or separate from their housemates/roommates. All individuals have barriers to community access based on Yorkshire House's practice that does not allow individuals to have keys to enter their home after the doors are locked at dark. Individuals, especially individuals who receive memory care services, have limited opportunities for interaction in and with the broader community.

Summary of Remediation Strategy

Yorkshire House has submitted a plan that describes their intention to ensure individuals receiving memory care services have increased opportunities for engagement in the community. Yorkshire House solicits input from individuals during conversations and meetings with the resident council. Yorkshire House documents individuals' preferences, likes, and goals in their Individual Service Plan (ISP). The activities director uses the ISP, individuals' feedback, council suggestions to plan activities. Staff encourage individuals receiving memory care services to participate in community activities with and without their roommates of their choice unless there is an assessed need documented in their ISP. Staff will be available to provided needed supports. All restrictions will be based on assessed needs, documented in the ISP, and discussed at admission, annually, and if there is a change.

All individuals, including those receiving memory care services, have freedom of movement throughout the campus unless based on assessed need, there are limitations to their movement. Yorkshire House gives individuals a key to the door, if individuals want unless otherwise documented in their ISP based on an assessed need. Any limitations or

restrictions are reviewed at least annually. Building A and B are licensed as a secure setting, and no one lives in Building A or B unless they have an assessed need for that type of setting. They are informed prior to admission of the locked gates and alarms on fences around Building A and B, and other alarms, locks, and delayed



	egress. Yorkshire House will ensure that restrictions for individuals receiving memory care services or assisted living services are based on assessed need, documented in the ISP, and reviewed at least annually.
