SUBJECT: PERINATAL PRACTICE GUIDELINES

PURPOSE

The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), in carrying out its responsibilities under state law, develops and continuously updates guidelines to address the special needs of pregnant women and women with dependent children (hereinafter known as pregnant and parenting women (PPW)).¹

The purpose of this Information Notice is to:

1. Inform counties and providers that the Perinatal Practice Guidelines (PPG) supersede the Perinatal Services Network Guidelines (PSNG) Fiscal Year (FY) 2016-17.
2. Inform counties and providers about the transition of the PSNG to the PPG.

DISCUSSION

To ensure counties and providers deliver comprehensive, quality substance use disorder (SUD) services to PPW, DHCS revised the PSNG FY 2016-17 to include requirements from State Plan Drug Medi-Cal and the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment Block Grant. As part of this process, DHCS renamed the PSNG. It is now referred to as the PPG. The PPG supersedes the PSNG FY 2016-17, and the PPG does not include new requirements.
