NOTICE OF GENERAL PUBLIC INTEREST AND REQUEST FOR PUBLIC INPUT ON STATE PLAN AMENDMENT 20-0003, WHICH PROPOSES TO ADJUST THE MEDI-CAL FEE-FOR-SERVICE REIMBURSEMENT RATES FOR CLINICAL LABORATORY SERVICES

This notice serves to provide information of public interest that the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) is seeking federal authority to adjust certain Medi-Cal Fee-For-Service (FFS) reimbursement rates for clinical laboratory services. DHCS requests input from beneficiaries, providers, and other interested stakeholders concerning proposed State Plan Amendment (SPA) 20-0003, which is attached below.

DHCS plans to submit SPA 20-0003 to the federal Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to obtain federal approval to adjust the reimbursement rates in accordance with Welfare and Institutions Code section 14105.22, which provides that reimbursement for clinical laboratory or laboratory services may not exceed 80 percent of the lowest maximum allowance established by the federal Medicare program for the same or similar services. Accordingly, DHCS plans to reduce Clinical Laboratory rates, if any, exceeding 80 percent of the corresponding Medicare rate to 80 percent of the Medicare rate for the same or similar service, effective January 1, 2020. The proposed rate adjustment will be based on the most recent corresponding Medicare rates published at the time of submission.

The proposed SPA is subject to approval by CMS.

DHCS estimates that the annual aggregate Medi-Cal expenditures for affected Clinical Laboratory rates will decrease by approximately \$1.3 million in total funds based on the most recent available data.

Public Review and Comments

The proposed changes included in draft SPA 20-0003 are enclosed in this notice for public comment. DHCS is requesting stakeholder input on the impact, if any, on access to services as a result of the proposed action.

- 4. Reimbursement rates for clinical laboratory or laboratory services as described in State Plan Attachment 3.1-A, paragraph 3, entitled "Laboratory, Radiological, and Radioisotope Services," will be developed by the Department of Health Care services (DHCS) using the following methodology:
 - a) Reimbursement rates for clinical laboratory or laboratory services shall be set at no more than 80 percent of the maximum allowance established by the federal Medicare Program for the same or similar services.
 - b) The ten percent payment reduction included in 4.19-B, page 3.3, paragraph (13) shall apply to the new rates calculated using the methodology described in this paragraph.
