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STATE HEALTH OFFICIALS DISCUSS FISCAL ANALYSIS OF THE BCRA'S DAMAGING IMPACT ON MEDI-CAL

WHAT: The California Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) will conduct a conference call to discuss the Department's preliminary fiscal analysis of the Medicaid provisions in the Better Care Reconciliation Act (BCRA). The BCRA adds potentially \$30 billion annually to the state's cost of funding by fundamentally changing the relationship between states and the federal government regarding the administration of the Medicaid program. The current proposal represents a significant shift of costs from the federal government to states.
