- SUBJECT: Mental Health Consumer Perception Survey Data Collection
- PURPOSE: To provide guidance to county Mental Health Plans (MHPs) on the requirements for the collection and submission of the 2025 Consumer Perception Survey (CPS)
- REFERENCE: Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5898; Title 9, California Code of Regulations (CCR) Section 3530.40

BACKGROUND:

The CPS survey is used to collect data for reporting on the federally determined National Outcome Measures (NOMs). Reporting on these NOMs is required by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, and receipt of federal Community Mental Health Services Block Grant funding is contingent upon the submission of this data.

MHPs are required to conduct the survey annually and submit data per Title 9 CCR Section 3530.40. Additionally, the <u>California Advancing and Innovating Medi-Cal</u> (CalAIM) Section 1915(b) Waiver, Special Terms and Conditions (STC) A10(c)(iii), requires the CPS to be conducted annually for members receiving care through the Specialty Mental Health program.



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POLICY:

The 2025 CPS survey period will take place from **Monday, May 19, 2025, through Friday, May 23, 2025**. DHCS contracts with the University of California Los Angeles – Integrated Substance Use and Addiction Programs (UCLA-ISAP) to scan and process the submitted surveys and aggregate the data. MHPs can collect survey data via paper survey forms or via an online survey link provided by UCLA-ISAP.

Persons at the county/local level responsible for data collection and reporting shall do the following:

- Download the data collection materials, including instructions and each of the CPS forms, from the UCLA-ISAP website. Links to the materials as well as the online surveys will be available on the UCLA-ISP website at <u>http://www.uclaisap.org/mh-consumer-perception-survey.html</u> by Friday, March 14, 2025. Forms are available for adults, older adults, youth, and family/parents of youth. Adult and older adult forms are available with or without *Quality-of-Life* survey items and counties may choose to use either form.
- 2. Administer the surveys during the collection period from May 19, 2025, through May 23, 2025.
- 3. Mail the original completed forms, as instructed below, no later than Monday, June 16, 2025, to the following address:

MHPs must take necessary steps to always safeguard the integrity of personal identifiable information, including secure packaging and shipping of survey forms. Please note the forms must be printed directly from the PDF documents on the UCLA website. Photocopied forms will not be accepted as they will not scan correctly. Other survey types or forms that have been modified in any way will not be accepted, as they cannot be aggregated with the standard forms.

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For MHPs that have Teleform software and wish to print forms locally from their Teleform Designer software, Teleform form definition files (Version 16.5) will also be available on the UCLA website.

MHPs who choose to scan/enter data locally must aggregate their data according to the data dictionaries available on the UCLA-ISP website at http://www.uclaisap.org/mh-consumer-perception-survey.html. Resulting data files should be uploaded to the UCLA Box folder no later than 5:00 pm on Friday, July 18, 2025.

Data files received after July 18, 2025, cannot be used in statewide reporting. MHPs must notify the UCLA staff below by June 9, 2025 if they plan to upload data files to the UCLA Box folder. MHPs will be able to retrieve electronic data files of their survey submissions by logging onto the DHCS website at <u>portal.dhcs.ca.gov</u>. The data will be posted in county-specific folders for download by December 2025.
