San Joaquin	County's new Electronic Health Record vendor (SmartCare) has not finalized the submittal process for DCR forms. Currently in a testing phase.	County anticipates submitting data in the first quarter of 2025.
San Mateo	County has checked in with FSP provider and developed a plan for becoming current with data submission. They will conduct an internal review to identify any missing newly admitted clients or discharge documentation by 9/27/24.	County will identify missing documentation and submit by October 4, 2024.
