SUPPLEMENTAL REPORTING LANGUAGE (SRL)

Background

In September 2023, the California Legislative Analyst's Office (LAO) published a request for programmatic data via the Supplemental Report of the 2023-24 Budget Act¹. The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) was assigned to report on the California Community Transitions (CCT) project.

CCT Project

The CCT is a demonstration project supported by both the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) and the State of California. CCT provides Medi-Cal members residing in institutional settings for stays of longer than 60 days with the opportunity and choice to transition back to their home or other community-based setting to receive the care and support that is medically necessary to maintain them in their home and community.

Some of the available services include:

- » Assistive devices
 - » Habilitation
 - » Home modification
 - » Home set-up
 - Family and informal caregiver training
 - » Personal care services
 - » Vehicle adaptations

Reporting Requirements

Per the published guidance,¹ the LAO requested CCT data on the following variables:

- » Reimbursement rates;
- » Participant demographic information; and
- » Project expenses.

CCT Data

Reimbursement Rates

The LAO requested information pertaining to the reimbursement rates for each year since 2014. Table 1 provides this data.

Methodology

To calculate the preceding reimbursement rates for each year since 2014, DHCS extracted data from:

Data Warehouse: DHCS extracted all claims and service units for CCT procedure codes G9012 U6, S5111 U6, S5165 HT, S5190 TS, T1019 U6, T2017 U6, T2028 U6, T2038 HT, & T2039 U6.

» <u>ISCD CCT Database</u>: The department extracted CCT enrollees/participant CINs, 1st Assessment Dates, Enrollment End Dates, and Participant End Dates.

Upon extracting the data, DHCS compared the MIS/DSS service dates to CCT enrollment dates and identified all claims specific to the CCT program. Additionally, the department calculated the paid rate by dividing the Medi-Cal reimbursement amount by the total units for each claim. Moreover, the Mode was used to determine the reported paid rate for each calendar year.

Reviews and Analysis

As previously noted, the reimbursement rates for each year since 2014 were extracted from the Data Warehouse (i.e., MIS/DSS) (e.g., claims) and ISCD CCT Database (e.g., CCT participants). Furthermore, the data was pulled from the approved CCT rates from 1/1/2014 and 11/15/2023.

Past Adjustments

Prior to 2023, DHCS has not adjusted the CCT reimbursement rates.

Transition Coordination Rate

In 2007, DHCS developed and implemented a transition reimbursement rate. The rate was \$45.43 per hour of transition case management rendered.

In addition, the LAO requested that DHCS provide for each year the Medi-Cal reimbursement rates for skilled nursing facilities (SNF). Table 2 lists the estimated weighted average statewide rate for the skilled nursing facilities (SNF), for rate years (RY) 2014-15 through RY 2023. Pursuant to the Medi-Cal Long-Term Care Reimbursement Act (Welfare & Institutions Codes sections 14126 - 14126.036), SNF rates are updated annually on a facility-specific basis based on audited cost reports subject to peer group and state-wide cost growth limits.

² Prior to January 1, 2021, Medi-Cal SNF rates were set on an August 1 to July 31 rate year. Beginning with 2021, the rate year aligns with the calendar year. The 2020 bridge period is from August 1 to December 31, 2020.

³ Weighted average rate is derived by (1) multiplying each facility-specific rate by Medi-Cal utilization projected for the facility at the time of the initial rate study and (2) dividing the sum by total Medi-Cal utilization projected for all facilities at the time of the initial rate study. The weighted average rate includes the Quality Assurance Fee (QAF) add-on for all rate years. The weighted average rate includes the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency Temporary Rate Increase for dates of service March 1, 2020, through December 31, 2023. The weighted average rate does not reflect rate recomputations due to audit appeals and changes in ownership. The weighted average rate does not include the subacute level of care and distinct part skilled nursing units of hospitals.

Estimated CCT Costs

For fiscal year 2024-2025, the estimated cost for each 1 percent increase in CCT reimbursement rates is \$58,819. To develop this estimate DHCS forecasted 2024-2025 fiscal year Demonstration costs based on 2021-2024 fiscal year claims and added one percent to the projected 2024-2025 Demonstration costs and calculated the difference between the projected annual total with the one percent increase and projected annual total.
