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### WPC – Los Angeles Overview

- \$900m (\$450m Federal funding) over 5 years
- 5 Target Populations and 11 projects; 50,000 annual enrollees
- 58% homelessness focused, 32% justice involved-reentry, 6% serious mental illness, 3% substance use, 1% medical high risk

Focus on:

Creating an integrated delivery system Care coordination & care management Addressing social needs Creating jobs for individuals with shared lived experience



## Implementation – No Staff, No Program, No Money

- Hiring adjust County HR processes; new jobs being created
- **Contracting** master agreements, flexible housing subsidy pool, multi-department contracting, contract incentives
- Care Management Platform build on old versus build new
- Training and Recruitment standardization, scaling up
- Data & Data Sharing legal hurdles, standardize collection, data governance
- Infrastructure Regional Coordinating Centers, Recuperative Care, Sobering Centers
- Partnership to CULTURE CHANGE Sheriff, Probation, Health Plans, Community Based Organizations, Community Clinics, Housing Authorities, etc.



#### Challenge or Opportunity – Probably Both

- New clinic model vs. Use existing clinic
- County operated vs. County-wide
- Contractor vs. County employee
- Scale up vs. Fill gaps
- Generate savings vs. Improve Value



## **County Support for WPC – Aligning Priorities**

- **Reentry Project:** Recent Board of Supervisors requested memo to describe changes needed to HR processes and practice so community health workers with "lived experience" (e.g., jail time) can and should be specially recruited.
- Homelessness Projects: Recent Board of Supervisor's motion to facilitate acquisition and development with non-WPC funds of additional "interim housing."
- Care Management Platform (CMP): Use of a focused and targeted solicitation to select CMP vendor; 2-3 month process
