2024 WCM Transitional Monitoring

WCM Monitoring Approach

DHCS is utilizing a multi-pronged approach to enable oversight and ensure compliance with WCM Transition policies.

WCM Transition Monitoring is an added layer of monitoring to the 2024 Transitional Monitoring.

MCP Survey Responses Timeline

The goal of MCP Survey Responses is to ensure MCPs are taking appropriate actions to carry out their transition obligations and identify disruptions to Member care for potential oversight actions.

- Kaiser is currently reporting Post Transitional Monitoring on a monthly basis.
- Kaiser will transition into "regular" quarterly monitoring beginning on July 1, 2024.

WCM Monitoring Overview

- » Kaiser continues to provide timely post-transition submissions.
- » Kaiser demonstrated consistent transition-related communication with WCM MCPs and Counties.
- » Kaiser has not received any Member Continuity of Care requests.
 - Kaiser confirmed zero requests during monitoring survey follow-up activities.
 - This is a testament to the enhanced protections requiring Kaiser to conduct outreach to out of network (OON) providers for this population.
- » Kaiser has completed outreach to 213 (100%) of OON providers, with 49% of agreements secured with providers who were considered OON.
- » Kaiser assigned care coordinators to all transitioning members prior to the January 1, 2024 implementation date.
- » Kaiser and the CCS Counties have reported good faith efforts in the WCM MOU negotiations.

WCM Monitoring: Provider Network

DHCS assessed Kaiser's complete network capacity and determined Kaiser had an adequate paneled provider network to serve the WCM population. This included an assessment of their existing network.

- » Kaiser has a robust network including all required facility types, specialties, and sub-specialties.
- » Kaiser has strong overlap with CCS-WCM providers providing services to WCM Members pretransition.
 - 100% for paneled providers
 - 79% for professional, allied, and medical support providers
 - 63% for Licensed Acute Care Hospitals
 - 92% for Special Care Centers
- » Kaiser is conducting additional contracting activities with the goal of increasing overlap with the network serving the transitioning population.
 - Kaiser will continue outreach to providers through end of Q2 2024 for purpose of securing a contract or CoC agreement
- » Kaiser provides monthly updates to DHCS and promptly addresses any inquiries.

2025 WCM Expansion

Collaborative Planning

- » DHCS organized a series of initial meetings with the 2025 WCM expansion MCPs and Counties in 2023 to kick off the collaborative planning process.
- Beginning in January 2024, DHCS resumed its collaborative planning meetings with the MCPs and Counties and as of February 2024 has organized a single monthly WCM 2025 meeting with the three MCPs and 12 Counties to work collaboratively together toward the January 1, 2025, implementation of the WCM expansion and share best practices.
- » DHCS is also hosting regular bi-monthly county meetings in 2024 to assist the counties in preparing for the January 1, 2025, WCM expansion.
- » DHCS will continue to organize additional ad hoc meetings with the MCPs and/or counties as necessary throughout 2024.

WCM Managed Care Plan Readiness

- » MCP plan readiness deliverables were released to the counties in March and the MCP readiness review process will launch in Quarter 2, 2024.
- » DHCS' readiness review evaluates the MCPs ability to implement services focusing on:
 - Provider network adequacy
 - Member communications
 - Contractual and regulatory compliance
 - MOUs with Counties
 - Transition plan with Counties
 - Continuity of Care Protocols
 - Key Deliverables/Policies & Procedures related to Access Standards, Credentialing Policy, Grievance and Appeals Assessment Protocols and Health Assessment Protocols

County Guidance and Readiness

- The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) has provided counties and MCPs with the WCM Information Notice and WCM County CCS Program Readiness Submission Checklist which include implementation guidance and additional details pertaining to the requirements of the WCM Program.
- The WCM Information Notice provides direction to County CCS Programs to work in partnership with MCPs operating in their county to implement the WCM Program.
- » The WCM County CCS Program Readiness Submissions Checklist includes the following deliverables:
 - Operational Transition Plan
 - Policies and Procedures
 - Memorandum of Understanding

Member Noticing

- » DHCS has developed 90/60/30-day notices and a Notice of Additional Information (NOAI) for the 2025 WCM Expansion. The notices will include detailed CCS/WCM transition information.
- The 90/60/30-day notices and the NOAI were provided to plans and stakeholders for review/feedback on March 22, 2024. Feedback is due April 5, 2024.
- » DHCS/Health Care Options (HCO) will mail the 90-day notice no later than 10/1/24.
- MCPs will mail a 60-day notice at the end of October 2024 and a 30-day notice at the end of November 2024.
- The NOAI will be posted on the DHCS website. The notices will include a link and a Quick Response (QR code) to the NOAI. MCPs and HCO will provide the full NOAI by mail for any member who requests a printed copy.

Provider Noticing

- » Notification to CCS-paneled providers will be released in Quarter 3, 2024.
- » A Provider Bulletin is scheduled to be published in October 2024.
- » A Provider Newsflash will be published monthly in October and November and weekly in December.

Timelines

Deferring Implementation to July 2025

- » DHCS is deferring the implementation start date of the CCS Compliance, Monitoring, and Oversight program from July 1, 2024, to July 1, 2025.
- » DHCS is continuing efforts to analyze the CCS county administrative allocation funding, finalize policy guidance referenced in the MOU, and provide counties with more time to prepare for implementation of the program. In addition, July 1, 2025, aligns with the CCS WCM expansion and implementation of CCS quality metrics.

Deferring Implementation to July 2025 (cont)

The deferral:

- » Allows counties twelve months to review and execute and implement the MOU with their correct January 1, 2025, county model type.
- » Provides time to finalize and communicate CCS county budget revisions.
- » Allows additional time to develop CCS quality metrics and implement them with the same date as this proposal of July 1, 2025.
- » Allows for the finalization of policy guidance referenced or affected by the MOU.
- Provides WCM expansion counties time to prepare for the January 1, 2025, transition including resolving current backlogs including Service Authorization Requests.*
- » Offers additional time for training counties and DHCS staff.

^{*}There are two counties transitioning from Classic Independent to WCM Independent and 10 counties transitioning from Classic Dependent to WCM Dependent.

Grievances

DHCS encourages all counties to implement a grievance process on July 1, 2024, to work through any before being required to report their grievances to DHCS on July 1, 2025.

- » DHCS will support counties during the transition period of July 1, 2024, to July 1, 2025, if needed


Dependent Counties

 - Publish Technical Assistance Guides.
 - Offer counties support and technical assistance on new reporting requirements.

Discussion

Child Health and Disability Prevention (CHDP) Program Transition

CHDP Program Transition Plan

- » A draft of the transition plan was released for public comment from September 27, 2023, through October 11, 2023.
- The hundreds of public comments received, in addition to the feedback compiled throughout Workgroup meetings, informed updates to the CHDP Program Transition Plan.
- » DHCS finalized the transition plan, and it is currently available online.

Ongoing CHDP Program Stakeholder Engagement

- » Outside of the CHDP Workgroup meetings, DHCS has been in communication with CHDP program stakeholders.
- » In December 2023, DHCS published <u>CHDP Provider Notice 23-04</u>, <u>CHDP Program Activities in Fiscal Year 2023-2024</u>, to provide counties and relevant stakeholders with guidance on post-CHDP program transition activities.
- » DHCS has been conducting ad hoc meetings with county CHDP programs for in-depth discussions and support leading up to the transition.

Ongoing CHDP Program Stakeholder Engagement (Continued)

- » DHCS continues to host CHDP Steering Committee meetings, HCPCFC Statewide Foster Care Subcommittee Quarterly Meetings, and other regular stakeholder meetings.
- » Medi-Cal Provider Bulletin: DHCS released the <u>Medi-Cal Provider</u> <u>Bulletin</u> on February 26, 2024.
- » On March 12, 2024, DHCS released guidance regarding the <u>Deadline</u> to <u>Submit the CHDP Provider Data Sheet (PM 177) Form</u>. PM 177's need to be submitted no later than June 15, 2024.

Post-CHDP Program Transition Activities

- » DHCS will continue to engage with stakeholders, release additional communications, and track relevant data leading up to and following July 1, 2024, to ensure a successful transition.
- » DHCS continues to monitor the <u>CHDPprogram@dhcs.ca.gov</u> inbox and will continue to do so leading up to the CHDP Program transition.

Discussion

California Children's Services (CCS) Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee

Authorizing Statute

Welfare & Institutions Code (WIC), section 14094.7 (b) requires DHCS to conduct the following activities by January 1, 2025:

- Annually provide an analysis on its website regarding trends on CCS enrollment for Whole Child Model (WCM) counties and non-WCM counties, in a way that enables a comparison of trends between the two categories of CCS counties.
- Develop utilization and quality measures, to be reported on an annual basis in a form and manner specified by the department, that relate specifically to CCS specialty care and report such measures for both WCM counties and non-WCM counties. When developing measures, the department shall consider:
 - Recommendations of the CCS Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee established by the department as part of the CCS Advisory Group pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section 14097.17.
 - Available data regarding the percentage of children with CCS eligible conditions who receive an annual special care center visit.

Authorizing Statute (continued)

- » Require, as part of its monitoring and oversight responsibilities, any WCM plan, as applicable, that is subject to one or more findings in its most recent annual medical audit pertaining to access or quality of care in the CCS program to implement quality improvement strategies that are specifically targeted to the CCS population, as determined by the department.
- Establish a stakeholder process pursuant to Section 14094.17.

For WCM MCPs results from the measures identified in this process may inform quality improvement efforts.

Goals of the CCS Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee

- The goal of the CCS Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee is to advise on the identification and implementation of quality and outcome measures for the CCS and WCM dashboard to drive improvements in health outcomes for children and youth.
- The Subcommittee will collaborate with external stakeholders including WCM Medi-Cal Managed Care Health Plans (MCP) and CCS Classic counties to create a dashboard that tracks program performance.
- 3-5 total measures should be identified and compared among both programs so external stakeholders, MCPs, and the public may access this information through the dashboard.
- When possible, there should be alignment between measures selected for WCM MCPs and Classic counties.

Goals of the CCS Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee (continued)

- » The goal of the CCS Redesign Performance Measure Quality Subcommittee is to recommend a succinct list of measures for data collection and reporting.
- >> The dashboard created by this effort will be utilized to improve CCS beneficiary health outcomes.
- The list of measures recommended to DHCS will ultimately be leveraged to inform processes and potential needs for future initiatives from DHCS, county CCS programs, and MCPs.
- The measures recommended to DHCS by this Subcommittee are separate and distinct from the CCS Compliance, Monitoring, and Oversight program.

Subcommittee Meetings

- » In February, the Subcommittee convened, reviewed, and discussed the following and voted on Tier 1 measures:
 - Key Subcommittee concepts for recommending measures including Principles for Measure Recommendations and Domains.
 - The measure recommendation process and roadmap.
- » On May 30, the Subcommittee will re-convene and continue this process.



Medi-Cal Continuous Coverage

- » DHCS launched the <u>Keep Your Community Covered Resources Hub</u> which includes resources in all 19 threshold languages.
- DHCS released the interactive Medi-Cal Continuous Coverage Unwinding Dashboard that will allow you to gain demographic and geographic insights to enrollment and renewal data.
- » Direct Medi-Cal members to <u>KeepMediCalCoverage.org</u> or <u>MantengaSuMedical.org</u>, which includes resources for members to update their information and find their local county offices. It will also allow them to sign up to receive email or text updates from DHCS.
