**Activity or Program Description:** Funds were used to support access to primary care services for the unhoused community within the city of Pleasanton, and particularly those individuals disproportionately impacted by substance use disorders. Funds allow for the weekly use of 1-on-1 primary care provider slots. During the primary care visit, the unhoused individual may receive the following services as necessary: screening of patient's social determinants of health (SDOH), care coordination consults and resources, primary care visit with an MD, warm handoffs to our integrated behavioral health team. Approximately [REDACTED] of the patients presenting for services have a history of significant substance use disorders or are currently using. Patients in this category experience negative health outcomes from their substance use, as well as continued exposure

to triggering situations (i.e. others using around them, availability of substances, etc). Some examples of the services provided during visits include: medical treatment for wounds, assessment of current medical conditions including chronic health concerns, referrals/assistance locating housing or being placed on waiting lists, disability paperwork, referrals for specialty care, lab orders, medications provided, medical coverage and applying for coverage, mental health and Substance Use Disorder referrals, and transportation vouchers.
