Why NCQA Health Plan Accreditation?



- Demonstrates a level of health plan performance and commitment to Quality
- Considered the "gold standard" for quality
- Member focus on wellness, Care Coordination, Access, Disease Management, and satisfaction
- Satisfies several DHCS GMC requirements
- Medicaid accredited plans perform better in areas of treatment and prevention than non-accredited plans

- Application fee \$15,000

Weighing the Advantages and Disadvantages...



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Leverage UHC's National NCQA team

Corporate credit

Gap analysis - estimated that 100% of Standards will be met

Meaningful CAHPS and HEDIS work now

Standards overlap with GMC requirements

Allows UHC to establish best practices soon after go-live

Disadvantages

Significant internal audit and oversight (CM, UM, DO, G&A)

Impact to small departments

High cost vs. small membership

Risk reporting Year 1-2 HEDIS/CAHPS rates

Inadequate time to establish baseline rates and improve scores

Will pull from competing priorities

Interim vs. First Survey



Interim Survey-


- Scored on Standards only and receive Interim Accreditation
- Accreditation is good for 18 months

• First Survey -

- Scored on Standards only and capped at Accredited
- Includes file review and more documents than Interim Survey
- Scoring with HEDIS[®]/CAHPS[®] is optional at any time if a Plan wishes to achieve higher than the Accredited level
- Accreditation is good for 3 years

Accreditation Timeline





Our Experience



- NCQA recommends beginning work to align with Standards 9 months before survey start date. Should be fully aligned with the requirements 6 months before survey start date.
 - We worked for 14 months to plan and meet all Standards; weekly meetings; managed all Standards on a work plan; added NCQA to QMC/Executive Leadership meeting agendas
 - Scored 100% on all Standards
- Dedicated 2 FTEs to NCQA planning
- Paid \$28,323 for 2019 Interim Survey
- Minimally resource intensive given Corporate Credit. Had to engage multiple departments to gather evidence
- Expect significant work to meet all First Survey requirements
 - Drafting new studies
 - File reviews
 - Preparing work plan now for when lookback period begins
 - Working to engage departments
