CalAIM In Lieu Of Services (ILOS) - Case Study #2

James Smith, a 45-year old member, has had three emergency room visits in the last four weeks with abdominal pain. He was subsequently diagnosed with Stage III colon cancer and metastasis to adjacent organs. He smokes and has not seen a PCP or specialist in several years. Mr. Smith had surgery to remove a tumor in his colon. Discharge instructions include: IV medications and wound care to continue for six weeks. Mr. Smith will begin chemotherapy in 4-6 weeks followed by radiation. Mr. Smith suffers from chronic homelessness and is currently residing on the streets.

Things to Consider:

- <u>Recuperative Care:</u> to provide a safe, clean place for post-operative services to be provided, to enable discharge from the hospital
- <u>Housing Transition/Navigation Services</u>: to assess if the member is a good candidate for housing placement, assisting the member in obtaining housing
- <u>Short-Term Post-Hospitalization Housing:</u> to continue supporting the member until an apartment is available
- Housing Deposits: to pay the first month's rent and security deposit to secure an apartment
- <u>Housing Tenancy and Sustaining Services</u>: to help the member and his new landlord develop a positive relationship prior to moving in and then once in the apartment, ensure that there aren't any ongoing issues that may jeopardize the lease agreement.

⇒ Mr. Smith would be a candidate for Enhanced Care Management due to his complex medical condition, his current chronic homelessness, and the need for planning and coordination at the highest level of intensity.
