Foster Care Demographics

- 56,780 in foster care
- 176,734 in Medi-Cal due to child welfare involvement
- 38% age 5 years and under
- 41% age 6 to 15 years
- Almost equally male and female

- 52% Hispanic
- 21% Black
- 22% White
- 2% Asian or Pacific Islander
- 1% Native American
- 2% Unknown

Foster Care Statistics

- Median number of months in foster care, beginning after the first eight days: 17.4
- 68% have two or fewer placements after one year in foster care
- 32% have three or more placements after one year in foster care
- 11% re-enter foster care within 12 months of reunification with their families



Medi-Cal Managed Care and Fee-for-Service

- In March 2020, there were 176,734 individuals touched by the child welfare system eligible for Medi-Cal
 - 44% Managed Care
 - 56% Fee-for-Service population

- 73% of children aged 0-17 years in foster care receive timely medical exams
- 67% of children aged 0-17 years in foster care receive timely dental exams
- Medical and dental exams are required by the end of specified age periods

Problems we are Solving

Identified Problems

- Interruption of continuity and stability
- Poorly defined outcomes and little accountability
 - Lack of data
- Difficult to navigate systems
 - Need more coordination and integration of services for youth
- Lack of capacity to meet the unique needs of foster youth: trauma, separation, and loss
- Need more timely and appropriate levels of care
- Inadequate focus on ensuring equity and equitable outcomes
