



## Northern and Southern California Community Dialogues: Options to Integrate Health and Long-Term Care for Dual Eligibles

The SCAN Foundation, together with the Center for Health Care Strategies (CHCS), is convening two community dialogues in Sacramento and in Orange County to encourage in-depth discussion of options to integrate health and long-term care services for Californians who are dually eligible for Medicare and Medi-Cal. Options to be discussed are outlined in the CHCS policy options document, <u>Options for Integrating Care for Dual</u> <u>Eligibles</u>.

The community dialogues seek to provide stakeholders an opportunity to learn more about the integrated care options and discuss these options as the state develops its Medicaid 1115 waiver renewal application. Feedback from the community dialogue will help inform subsequent efforts of the California Department of Health Care Services 1115 Waiver Technical Workgroup focused on dual eligibles.
