## Background

## **Managed Care Organization Tax**

Assembly Bill (AB) 119 (Chapter 13, Statutes of 2023) authorized a Managed Care Organization (MCO) tax effective April 1, 2023, through December 31, 2026. MCO tax revenues will be used to support the Medi-Cal program including, but not limited to, new targeted provider rate increases and other investments that advance access, quality, and equity for Medi-Cal members and promote provider participation in the Medi-Cal program. The Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) received <u>federal approval</u> of the MCO tax on December 15, 2023.

## **Principles**

- Strengthen Medi-Cal's foundation by providing long-term certainty for provider rate increases to drive greater Medi-Cal provider participation, especially in underserved areas and in primary and preventive care.
- » Preserve eligibility and benefit expansions in the Medi-Cal program.
- » Create conditions to alleviate disparities and achieve equity within the Medi-Cal program.
- » Maximize opportunities to draw additional federal matching funds to support the Medi-Cal program.
