DHCS response DHCS offers 17 threshold languages for beneficiary communication. No other languages are used in provider outreach efforts at this time. DHCS identifies underserved counties through reports of enrollment numbers for each county. Counties that have a ratio of beneficiaries to providers lower than the statewide ratio are considered to be underserved. DHCS compares provider-participation ratios with county-specific licensed dentist-to-general population benchmarks. DHCS uses age and ethnicity stratifications in identifying low-utilizing counties to compare between children and adults, as well as between different racial/ethnic groups. The financial impact of this recalculation was reflected in the January 2018 D1 payment, and PY 1 expenditures/payments will likely be fully realized by the July 2018 payment.	
Services outside of the U.S.: Does Denti-Cal cover dental providers who accept Medi-Cal in Tijuana (or other border areas)?	Out-of-country services are covered only for emergencies (hospital authorizations are processed at the Medi-Cal field office) – services require an emergency certification statement, and are a benefit only for approved inpatient services, federal law prohibits otherwise.
