SUBJECT: TITLE IV-E CHILDREN

This letter is to provide you with information on Title IV-E requirements, and to request your assistance with certain foster care children who reside in out-of-state for-profit facilities.

Title IV-E Federal regulations require that the facility in which a foster care child resides be nonprofit. The Department of Health Services has learned that some California foster care children reside in out-of-state for-profit facilities. Passage (in Nevada) and Vision Quest (in Arizona) are among them. Children residing in these facilities are not Federally eligible, but are, nonetheless, eligible to receive Medi-Cal cards under the State-only program. Some of these foster care children are not receiving Medi-Cal cards as they should, due to a combination First, MEDS suppresses cards for Title IV-E of two factors: foster care beneficiaries who have an out-of-state zip code. (This practice conforms with the recent change in Federal law which makes the state in which a federally eligible child resides responsible for his/her Medicaid.) Secondly, some counties assign Federal aid codes (42) to foster care children living in for-profit facilities. To ensure that foster care children who are placed in a for-profit out-of-state facility continue receiving Medi-Cal, please make sure that they are assigned a non-Federal aid code (40, 41, or 45).
