IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING THE MEDI-CAL ESTATE RECOVERY PROGRAM FOR BENEFICIARIES 55 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER

After a Medi-Cal beneficiary passes away, the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) may seek repayment from their estate subject to probate, for Medi-Cal benefits on or after their 55th birthday. Repayment includes certain fee-for-service and managed care premiums/capitation payments. Repayment cannot exceed the value of a beneficiary's estate subject to probate.

DHCS will only pursue repayment if the following apply:

- The Medi-Cal beneficiary received nursing facility services and/or home and communitybased services on or after their 55th birthday* and
- The Medi-Cal beneficiary has real or personal property and/or other assets, as of their date
 of death, that will be part of their estate subject to probate

Additionally, DHCS will not pursue repayment if:

- There is a surviving spouse or surviving registered domestic partner
- There is a surviving child who is under 21 years of age
- There is a surviving child (of any age) who is blind or disabled, as defined by the federal Social Security Act

DHCS will never collect more than either the value of the Medi-Cal beneficiary's estate subject to probate or the amount paid by DHCS for Medi-Cal benefits provided to the Medi-Cal beneficiary, whichever is less. Certain income and resources of American Indians and Alaska Natives are exempt from estate recovery.

When a Medi-Cal beneficiary passes, the person handling the estate **must give written notice of the death, within 90 days of the date of death**, to the Director of DHCS. The notice and a copy of the death certificate must be submitted online at dhcs.ca.gov/ER or mailed to: Department of Health Care Services, Estate Recovery Program, MS 4720, P.O. Box 997425, Sacramento, CA 95899-7425. Agency does-not-satisfy-this-requirement.

Medi-Cal beneficiaries or their authorized representative may submit a Request for Medi-Cal Expenses Subject to Estate Recovery, form DHCS 4017, once per calendar year for a \$5 processing fee if the beneficiary is 55 years of age or older or a permanent inpatient of a nursing or long-term care facility. ^{*} The State may collect from Medi-Cal beneficiaries of any age who have been determined "permanently institutionalized." An individual is determined to be "permanently institutionalized" when they are an inpatient in a nursing facility, are not expected to return home, and have had the opportunity for a hearing regarding their "permanently institutionalized" status.
