- REFERENCE: WELFARE AND INSTITUTIONS CODE SECTION 5899 AND CALIFORNIA CODE OF REGULATIONS (CCPR), TITLE 9, SECTIONS 3510, 3510.010 AND 3510.20

This Information Notice informs counties of a new reporting requirement related to the expenditure of Mental Health Services Act (MHSA) funding, effective January 1, 2018. Welfare and Institutions Code Section 5899 (f) requires counties to report, on the Annual MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report, the amount of MHSA funds spent on mental health services for veterans.

Counties are required to begin reporting this expenditure information on the FY 2018-19 Annual MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report, which includes expenditures made from July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.

Counties must report total MHSA funds spent on mental health services provided to veterans for all programs and projects funded through the Community Services and

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Supports, Prevention and Early Intervention, and Innovation components, combined. Counties do not need to report MHSA funds spent on mental health services for veterans separately by component. DHCS will update the FY 2018-19 Annual MHSA Revenue and Expenditure Report template to allow counties to report this expenditure information.
