SUBJECT: PREGNANCY RELATED SERVICES IN DRUG MEDI-CAL

## PURPOSE

This communicates the Drug Medi-Cal (DMC) policy for pregnancy-related services. The Short-Doyle claim processing system was programmed effective May 29, 2014, to implement this policy, and this policy is being applied retroactively to service dates on or after July 1, 2013.

## DISCUSSION

In the case of a pregnant or postpartum beneficiary whose basis for Medi-Cal eligibility is an aid code which provides pregnancy-related services only, the DMC policy is:

- 1. The beneficiary assigned a pregnancy-related services aid code may receive a nonperinatal DMC service.
- 2. The DMC claim for such a beneficiary will be reimbursed at the federal financial participation (FFP) percentage as allowed by the beneficiary's aid code, regardless of whether a perinatal or non-perinatal service is received. Some pregnancy-related services aid codes reimburse at 50 percent FFP, others at 65 percent FFP, and the Affordable Care Act, newly-eligible adult aid code M2 reimburses at 100 percent FFP.
- 3. If the beneficiary receives a non-perinatal service, that service will be reimbursed at the <u>non-perinatal</u> DMC rate.
- 4. Regardless of whether a pregnant/postpartum beneficiary receives a perinatal or non-perinatal DMC service, the Short Doyle pregnancy indicator field must be set to "Yes" when the claim is submitted in Short Doyle for adjudication, or the claim will be denied.
