How to Enroll as an EWC Primary Care Provider



- » Before initiating the enrollment process you must:
 - Be an active Medi-Cal Provider in good standing
 - Have a valid National Provider Identifier (NPI)
 - Be eligible to submit claims for payment through the Medi-Cal billing system, in accordance with Welfare and Institutions Code Section 14043.26.
 - Have Eligible Provider Types (please refer to the checklist, slide 9)
 - Have a network of referral providers to provide screening and diagnostic services.



EWC is not just about free breast and cervical cancer services. Enrolled providers must:

- » Have clinical and comprehensive case management systems in place, including tracking and follow-up systems, that support quality program and clinical standards.
- » Have personnel designated to:
 - Determine eligibility and enroll EWC Applicants.
 - Collect and submit program-required data into the EWC program webbased data collection system.



How to enroll:

- » Contact your Regional EWC Clinical Coordinator
- » Complete a DHCS FORM 8475 Primary Care Provider Enrollment Application (EWC PCPEA):
 - Application is available on EWC Website
- » Submit EWC PCPEA to the EWC Program.
- » A PCP Applicant will receive an approval or denial on submitted application
- » An approval of the EWC PCPEA must be received prior to offering covered services under the EWC Program
- » An enrolled EWC PCP must complete a EWC Program Orientation and Training prior to providing any EWC program covered services
