

SUBJECT: CHDP HEALTH ASSESSMENT GUIDELINES ADDITIONAL REVISIONS

The purpose of this CHDP Provider Information Notice is to inform CHDP Providers and Medi-Cal managed health care plans about additional revisions to the CHDP Health Assessment Guidelines (CHDP Guidelines) and their availability on the CHDP website. The purpose of the CHDP Guidelines is to set CHDP provider standards for pediatric health assessments for children served by the CHDP Program. These CHDP Guidelines can be used by CHDP providers; Medi-Cal managed care health plans, and other healthcare professionals. These guidelines are consistent with the AAP Bright Futures™ Guidelines and provide guidance to ensure compliance with California state specific regulations. The Systems of Care Division encourages you to review each section in its entirety.

All CHDP providers are required to comply with the most recent AAP <u>Bright Futures</u> <u>Guidelines</u> and the AAP Bright Futures <u>Recommendations for Preventive Pediatric</u> <u>Health Care</u> (periodicity table)\*. Please refer to the "Resources" section below.

All CHDP providers are also required to comply with any additional state regulatory requirements for risk assessments and testing as outlined in the <a href="CHDP Health">CHDP Health</a> <a href="Assessment Guidelines">Assessment Guidelines</a> (<a href="http://www.dhcs.ca.gov/services/chdp/Pages/HAG.aspx">http://www.dhcs.ca.gov/services/chdp/Pages/HAG.aspx</a>).

Please note that the CHDP Program is continuing to update the CHDP Guidelines to meet Bright Futures Guidelines, as well as state regulations that may supersede some of the Bright Futures periodicity requirements for screening and testing. As a result, there may be some differences between the CHDP Guidelines and Bright Futures Guidelines. There will be future CHDP notices with guideline revisions to the CHDP Guidelines.

CHDP uses the term "Health Assessments" which is not a term used in the Bright Futures periodicity schedules. Health assessments include Bright Futures periodicity categories: history, measurements, sensory screening, developmental/behavioral health, physical examinations, procedures, oral health, and anticipatory guidance.
