Davina from For the Village here - Can someone confirm if Molina has paid out the rate increase to ANY doula at all? We've gotten two responses from them about why we're getting the 2023 rates - a) that doulas are not listed as "primary care providers" in their system and the Tri rate increase specifically notes that increases apply to Primary Care providers so doulas were not included and they did not make those updates in their system, and b) that we are not getting the updated rates because we are on an LOA contract not a full contract (which we are working on but they don't know how to do that given our doulas hold their own liability insurnace). Those two answers are vastly different and if the reality is A then it's a HUGE issue because that means it would apply to every single doula provider in their network

Hello Davina -- Molina has attested to their compliance with the 2024 Targeted Rate Increases (TRI). Regarding a), doulas are an eligible provider type for the TRI rates; see page 2 of All Plan Letter 24-007,

If you continue to receive this response, please reach out to DHCS and we can provide clarification to the health plan. Regarding b), the TRI policy applies to network providers only; an LOA is not a network provider agreement and, thus, not sufficient to meet that requirement.

You can even augment a training if it doesn't contain a required topic (for instance take a separate lactation support training). Where are you located? I would reach out to doulas in your community to find an affordable training, or reach out to trainers to ask about affordable trainings or payment plans or scholarships. There is also the experience pathway if you have already been serving community as a doula.
