SUBJECT: MEDI-CAL ELIGIBILITY DATA SYSTEM CHANGES TO THE INCARCERATION AND SUSPENSION PROCESS (Reference: ACWDLs 14-26, 14-26E, 17-29, and 17-29E)

<u>Purpose</u>

The purpose of this letter is to inform Counties and the Statewide Automated Welfare Systems (SAWS) of changes to the Medi-Cal Eligibility Data System (MEDS) to process incarceration and suspension status for individuals who are known to MEDS. These changes are part of an overall change to the incarceration process and the way incarceration and release information is reported to, and suspension is processed by, MEDS. The SAWS, in partnership with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS), are expected to make system changes in order to implement the changes in processing of incarceration and suspension, when necessary. The MEDS changes outlined in this letter do not change previously provided policy guidance to incarceration, suspension of Medi-Cal Benefits or eligibility to the Medi-Cal Inmate Eligibility Program (MCIEP) via All County Welfare Directors Letters (ACWDLs) 14-26 and 14-26E. Any changes in policy regarding incarceration, suspension or eligibility to the MCIEP will continue to be provided through ACWDLs.

Background

Currently, either the County Welfare Department (CWD) or DHCS will receive notification when an individual has become incarcerated. If the individual is on active Medi-Cal, a suspension of benefits is processed using the online MEDS transaction

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EW32. The EW32 transaction is used to report an incarceration (initiating suspension), report a release (ending suspension), and to correct previously reported suspension and/or release dates. Suspension status has historically been displayed in MEDS as an Other Health Coverage (OHC) indicator of "I" (Institutionalization) and may include an OHC SOURCE of either "I" (County reported Institutionalization) or "J" (County reported release from Institutionalization) for releases that occur mid-month. MEDS allows suspension to be added or removed on a daily basis.

Overview of MEDS Changes to Incarceration and Suspension Processing

The summary below highlights a number of changes implemented in MEDS which serve to improve and enhance the incarceration and suspension process. SAWS consortia are expected to make programming changes to coordinate with the MEDS changes in order to automate reporting of incarceration to MEDS, when necessary. SAWS have been informed of MEDS implementation dates for the changes outlined below. Future updates will be provided through the use of the existing notification process of Work Groups, Change Cycle letters and 60-Day Notices. MEDS Manual and MEDS Network Reference Guides will be updated to reflect changes to processes and data elements.

Summary of Changes

- MEDS will use existing functionality to indicate incarceration, suspension and release dates in the new INCARCERATION AND SUSPENSION INFORMATION (INQU) Screen. The OHC indicator "I" is no longer being used to indicate suspension. OHC Source Codes "I" and "J" are no longer being used to indicate a release within the month. The Health Insurance System (HIS) is no longer being used to store suspension periods.
- II. The new Restriction Codes in conjunction with Eligibility Status Code indicate incarceration for both full and partial months. The combination of Restriction Codes and Eligibility Status Codes utilizes existing MEDS logic to update Health Care Plan (HCP) enrollment status to indicate suspension, disenrollment, and recoupment, and will update Medicare Buy-In status to end or restart the Buy-In process. The Restriction Codes populate across MEDS Medi-Cal segments with the exception of INMATE, PAROLE and General Relief/Cash Assistance Program for Immigrants (GR/CAP) segments, allowing eligibility to be added or terminated as needed without interruption to eligibility in the excepted segments.

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If the individual is incarcerated and released on the same day, there is no restriction to any active Medi-Cal benefits. The Eligibility Status Codes are not affected for INMATE, PAROLE, or GR/CAP segments in MEDS when a restriction is placed on the Medi-Cal segment(s). The new Restriction Codes are included in Attachment A and in the MEDS Quick Reference Guide.

- III. MEDS will keep current and historical incarceration and suspension status information and has the ability to store multiple incarceration dates, suspension dates, and release dates, including multiple incarceration periods occurring within the same month. This information is viewable by users through the INQU screen. This screen is updated through the use of the online EW32 transaction, through direct reporting to the State, and in a future enhancement, through a batch EW32 transaction. Detailed screen information is provided in the MEDS Manual.
- IV. IN/OUT MEDS functionality will no longer be used to indicate beginning and ending periods of eligibility to MCIEP. Full month eligibility for MCIEP is currently viewable by users through the Special Program Information screens in MEDS. Partial month eligibility for MCIEP is currently viewable by users through the Inmate Program Aid Codes Inquiry (INQV) screen. Detailed screen information is provided in the MEDS Manual. Note: The screen name will be changed to 'Date Specific Aid Codes Inquiry'. The future update will be provided through a Change Cycle Letter.
- V. The EW32 online transaction screen has been updated by replacing suspension date fields with incarceration date fields. The suspension date is determined by MEDS and is not user editable. The EW32 online transaction processing has been enhanced to allow incarceration and release date corrections to record more than eight months in the past.

NOTE: The EW32 transaction processes through overnight batch. In cases where immediate need for services must be established, the County shall follow standard Immediate Need process by utilizing the EW15 transaction. The EW15 transaction allows immediate need benefits to be issued when a MEDS record is indicated as incarcerated. In order to have eligibility reflected for the remainder of the month, the EW32 transaction must be submitted on the same day as the EW15.

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- VI. New MEDS alerts will be created and changes to existing MEDS alerts may occur as changes to MEDS are implemented. New MEDS Alerts details will be provided through the Change Cycle Letter process.
- VII. New online messages have been created and added to the MEDS Manual and are included in Attachment A.
- VIII. Current existing incarceration records have been converted to the new functionality, outlined in items # I VII above, concurrently with implementation. Existing suspension information (Policy Start/Stop Dates) previously displayed in the HIS screen was converted to the INQU Screen. The Policy Start Date was converted into the Incarceration and Suspend Date fields. These dates are the same because the individual was incarcerated at the time the suspension was established. This can be corrected if the actual incarceration date is known. The Policy Stop Date was converted into the Suspend End Date field and the Release Date is the day following the Suspend End Date. This can be corrected if the actual Release Date is known.
 - IX. The MEDS Manual will be updated to include enhancements to the EW32 transaction and a new section for the Incarceration process.

Attachments:

Attachment A provides definitions of full and partial month MCIEP aid codes and incarceration periods, along with definitions of incarceration, release, and suspend dates. Attachment A also provides online messages for the EW32 transaction and new Restriction Code definitions and usage.

Attachment B provides examples of how the new functionality will process incarceration, release, suspension, changes to incarceration and release dates, and MCIEP eligibility.

Attachment C provides frequently asked questions and answers for the incarceration process, including suspension, new incarceration and release date fields, and corrections.

The changes described in I through VIII above were implemented beginning March 2020 Month of Eligibility (MOE). Subsequent to the initial implementation, planned

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enhancements have been scheduled. Implementation dates for the subsequent enhancements will be provided through the stakeholder work group, Change Cycle letters, and 60-Day Notices. MEDS Manual and MEDS Network Reference Guides have been updated with the changes described in this letter.

Definition of Full Month vs. Partial Month MCIEP Aid Codes and Incarceration Periods

Full Month MCIEP Aid Code

An individual has full month eligibility in a particular Aid Code if the coverage is continuous from the first day of the month through the last day of the month. (Example: Aid Code is effective June 1 through June 30.)

Partial Month MCIEP Aid Code

An individual has partial month eligibility in a particular Aid Code if the coverage is not continuous from the first day of the month through the last day of the month. (Example: Individual is incarcerated on June 3rd and is released on August 5th. Both June and August are partial months. July is a full month.)

Full Month of Incarceration

A full month of incarceration is incarceration from the last day of the previous month through the first day of the next month. (Example: Individual is incarcerated on June 30; the first full day of incarceration is July 1st. Individual is released on August 1st; the last full day of incarceration is July 31st.)

Partial Month of Incarceration

A partial month of incarceration is incarceration that starts on the first day of the month or later and/or a release that occurs on the last day of the month or sooner. (Example: Individual is incarcerated on August 1st; the first full day of incarceration is August 2nd resulting in a partial month of incarceration. The individual is released on August 15th; the last full day of incarceration is August 14th.) The day of incarceration and day of release are not counted as full days of incarceration since they could receive Medi-Cal services on the same day they were incarcerated or released.

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Incarceration and Suspension Questions and Answers

1. The County needs to correct an incarceration date that is over 12 months in the past. How does the County complete this process?

<u>Answer:</u> The EW32 transaction now allows for reporting of incarceration information that is further back than 12 months so that the case can be handled appropriately based on an incarceration more than 12 months prior to the current MEDS month. Refer to the MEDS manual for the EW32 transaction instructions.

 On 9/01/2020, the County reported an Incarceration Date of 8/31/2020 on the EW32 transaction for a Medi-Cal beneficiary. Why does the INCARCERATION AND SUSPENSION INFORMATION (INQU) screen display the Suspend Date as 9/01/2020, and the Restriction Code and Eligibility Status Code indicate partial month of incarceration in August 2020?

<u>Answer</u>: The Suspend Date field in the INQU screen displays the Suspension Start Date, which is derived from the date the EW32 transaction was processed. The MEDS eligibility screens update the Eligibility Status Codes and Restriction Codes based upon the first full day and last full day of incarceration. Please refer to Attachment A of this MEDIL for the complete definition of full month vs. partial month incarceration periods, Suspend Date and Suspend End Date.

3. The County attempted to correct an Incarceration Date, but an error is being displayed on the screen. Where can I find information to resolve the issue?

<u>Answer</u>: Refer to the MEDS Manual Online Messages documentation to review the message detail including recommended actions to take to resolve the error. If the error cannot be resolved, please submit a Remedy ticket with screenshots for review.

4. The County entered a closed incarceration period on the EW32 transaction. Why didn't the system auto-populate a Suspend Date?

<u>Answer</u>: A closed incarceration period implies the dates are in the past, therefore, suspension of Medi-Cal benefits does not apply. Refer to All County Welfare Directors Letters (ACWDLs) 14-26 and 14-26E for current suspension policy. In addition, refer to Attachment A of this MEDIL for the complete definition of Suspend Date and Suspend End Date. Any changes in policy regarding incarceration and suspension will continue to be provided through ACWDLs.

5. There is an outstanding Remedy ticket for an OHC "I" indicator that could not be removed from a record manually in MEDS. Will these new MEDS enhancements resolve the remedy issue?

<u>Answer</u>: The new MEDS enhancement will resolve the issue of not being able to submit dates older than 8 months. In addition, after the existing incarceration records are converted to display the new information (Restriction Code & Eligibility Status Code rather than OHC "I"), the DHCS MEDS Process Unit will review the open incarceration Remedy tickets to analyze those records where the conversion was not successful and resolve.

Medi-Cal Inmate Eligibility Program (MCIEP) Questions and Answers

6. The INQE MEDS screen continues to display the MCIEP IN/OUT days.

<u>Answer</u>: The MCIEP IN/OUT days is scheduled to be removed after implementation of the new functionality.

7. The County determined MCIEP eligibility is effective on 9/1/2020; however, MEDS is not displaying this information on the INMATE PROGRAM AID CODES INQUIRY (INQV) MEDS screen.

<u>Answer</u>: The INQV screen displays partial month MCIEP eligibility only. Verify the Eligibility Status Code for September 2020 month located on the INMATE segment in INQ1, INQ2, or INQ3 to verify full month eligibility for MCIEP.

8. The County reported the Release Date on the EW32 transaction for a Medi-Cal beneficiary enrolled in M1 and County MCIEP N7 aid code. MEDS populated the Suspend End Date properly, but why aren't the Medi-Cal benefits restored?

<u>Answer</u>: Per ACWDL 17-29, MCIEP coverage takes precedence over any other aid codes in MEDS. The County should follow current processes for terminating the County MCIEP aid codes.

9. Will the MCIEP aid code be terminated in MEDS when the EW15 and EW32 are submitted?

Answer: No. To terminate the MCIEP, the EW40 is still required.

Immediate Need Questions and Answers

10. Will the Medi-Cal suspension end when the EW15 is submitted?

<u>Answer</u>: No. The EW32 must be submitted on the same day to add the Release Date. MEDS will add the Suspend End Date and update the Eligibility Status and Restriction Codes.

11. The County reported a Release Date on the EW32 transaction to restore the beneficiary's suspended Medi-Cal benefits. Why doesn't the transaction update immediately?

<u>Answer</u>: The EW32 transaction will process in the overnight batch. When the EW32 is submitted, the eligibility will be active the following business day and will be effective the date of the release. If immediate need for services is needed, the County shall follow the Immediate Need process and submit the EW15 transaction on the same day. The County will need to complete the EW20 transaction to prevent renewal from discontinuing eligibility for the following month.

12. Should the County enter information (e.g. "000") in the Restriction field of the EW15 transaction on MEDS?

<u>Answer</u>: No, the Restriction Code field should be left blank when submitting the EW15 transaction. MEDS will update the Restriction Code(s) as appropriate based on the incarceration status. Note: If a Restriction Code prior to the incarceration is displayed on the record, use existing processing to remove or update.

13. Does the County enter an Eligibility Status Action Code (ESAC) on the EW15 transaction?

<u>Answer</u>: Yes, the ESAC field should not be left blank. For applicable ESAC codes, please refer to the EW15 MEDS User Manual for details.

Pre-Release Questions and Answers

14. What should the County do if eligibility is established for the month of release and then the release date changes to a later month? Assume it is too late to correct the eligibility already established for the original month of release.

<u>Answer</u>: The County must follow current Medi-Cal suspension rules. Current Medi-Cal rules require that counties suspend the Medi-Cal benefits of a Medi-Cal beneficiary when the County is made aware that a beneficiary is an inmate of a public institution. Therefore, the County must report the Incarceration Date through the EW32 transaction to suspend the benefits and then report the Release Date to restore benefits, if still eligible. Refer to ACWDLs 14-24, 14-24E, 14-26, and 14-26E. Any changes in policy regarding

incarceration, suspension or eligibility to the MCIEP will continue to be provided through ACWDLs.

15. A Pre-Release application was completed and the individual was determined eligible for a SSA-controlled aid code for the month of release. However, the EW32 transaction is rejecting the County's attempt to report the Release Date to end the suspension and restore benefits.

<u>Answer</u>: The County should submit a Remedy ticket for any situation in which the County cannot update the MEDS record.

EW32 Transaction Correction Question and Answer

16. When a correction to the incarceration period is completed in MEDS, will the beneficiary have fee-for-service Medi-Cal for the corrected months the beneficiary was not actually incarcerated?

<u>Answer</u>: The Health Care Plan (HCP) status will function as it currently does. If the beneficiary has already been dis-enrolled from the HCP, the Medi-Cal will remain as Fee-For-Service (FFS) for those months. If the beneficiary has not been dis-enrolled from the health plan and still has HCP Status as on hold, the beneficiary will be re-enrolled in the health care plan. Any future updates will be notified through a Change Cycle Letter.
