**Activity or Program Name:** Lestonnac Free Clinic - Street Medicine and Referral to SUD Treatment Program

**Activity or Program Description:** Through the Street Medicine and Referral to SUD Treatment Program, Lestonnac Free Clinic conducts weekly outreach sessions of up to eight hours per week. Weekly outreach includes

deployment of three medical personnel into the field per shift offering evaluation, treatment, and referrals as needed. This program also assists in the distribution of Naloxone or other opioid overdose reversal medication to individuals reporting opioid use disorder.

Individuals experiencing homelessness face many barriers to care in traditional medical treatment facilities and often delay care exacerbating chronic health conditions or becoming vulnerable to transmission of infectious diseases. This program brings needed medical services out in the field and offers care evaluation and treatment directly on the street. This program also assist in prevention efforts for any potential opioid overdoses through the distribution of Naloxone.</p>

**Activity or Program Name:** Action Alliance Foundation

**Activity or Program Description:** Action Alliance Foundation, through Opioid Settlement funds, provides comprehensive wrap-around services to individuals in recovery, including housing transportation, and job placement and/or training.
