## Activity#1

**Activity or Program Name:** Interventions to prevent drug addiction in vulnerable youth (Reference: BHIN-24-002, Page 6, Dated 1/2/2024)

**Activity or Program Description:** The City of Fremont is one of three adolescent / young adults outpatient Substance Use Treatment providers in Alameda County. A small portion of funding was used to support activities that reduce the risk of vulnerable youth developing an SUD. The funds were used to help support the work of substance use and addiction counselors in the Adolescent and Transitional Age Youth Substance Use Treatment Program run by the City's Human Services Department's Youth and Family Services clinic. These services are provided to youth in schools in the cities of Fremont, Newark, and Union City, which may include youth in foster care, juvenile justice-impacted youth, youth from communities of color, and/or experiencing adversities related to socioeconomic status, gender, sexual orientation, and mental health conditions. The funding enabled us to provide educational presentations on health impacts of drug and alcohol use, including the risks of opioid overdose and substance misuse, to youth attending health classes at schools in Fremont, Union City and Newark. Through 27 dynamic and engaging class presentations, a total of 1,162 youth received prevention education, which is designed to foster awareness and understanding. These impactful sessions not only heightened awareness but also facilitated numerous referrals. As a result, 67 youth were evaluated, diagnosed, and thoughtfully recommended for treatment, marking a significant step toward their well-being and care.

<b>HIAA 5:</b> Interventions to prevent drug addiction in vulnerable youth Please describe, including the populations this activity or program serves:	Interventions to prevent drug addiction in vulnerable youth. Funding to offset a portion of personnel cost incurred by the City of Fremont's Adolescent and Young Adult Substance Use Disorder (SUD) treatment program for the program to provide psychoeducational prevention workshops and classes for middle and high school aged students in Fremont. Fremont, as the fourth largest city in the Bay Area, has five (5) middle and five (5) high schools. These classes address the risks associated with drugs, opioids, and alcohol use and provide guidance on accessing intervention services and other critical resources for treatment, recovery, and prevention. The city's SUD program provides counseling and recovery support to youth and young adults with Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) and co-occurring SUD/Mental Health conditions so that youth may be easily linked with treatment and recovery services because of need identification during the prevention programming.

## Activity#2

**Activity or Program Name:** Leadership planning and coordination (Reference: BHIN-24-002, Exhibit E, Schedule B, Part III (J), Page E-13)

**Activity or Program Description:** Developed local public/private collaborative workgroup made up of government, non-profit providers, hospital, first responders, pharmacies and organizations that are providing first response, harm reduction and treatment to individuals and communities that are impacted by Opioids. This effort consisted of listening sessions, focus groups, planning groups to identify local factors, target populations, geographic areas of focus, and to plan collective impact efforts to raise public awareness, and coordinate intervention and harm reduction strategies.
