<p>HIAA 5: Interventions to prevent drug addiction in vulnerable youth Please describe, including the populations this activity or program serves:</p>	<p>The Community Outreach Advocate (COA) involvement in preventing drug addiction in vulnerable youth includes her work to become a certified facilitator of an evidence-based practice called Mindfulness Based Interventions. This DHCS-supported curriculum was originally piloted at the California Department of Corrections, Division of Juvenile Justice. The goal of the program is to help youth grow more mindful about substance use and recovery through: 1) Adopting meditation and mindfulness practices 2) Creating self-awareness and perspective-taking of various areas of their lives. Under the guidance of the program developers, the position co-facilitated Glenn County SUDS' first cohort of a 'Healthy Minds' group using the Mindfulness Based Interventions curriculum. She conducted thorough outreach to all of the County's high schools, creating awareness about the program and ultimately collecting 28 youth referrals (primarily from high-risk populations, such as our County's continuation schools). The program was incredibly successful and well-received by the youth. In addition, the COA collaborates with school-based programs, including Friday Night Live and Glenn County Office of Education nursing staff, to provide prevention education and information on services.</p>
