Activity or Program Name: Harm Reduction Efforts

Activity or Program Description: The opioid settlement funds have been strategically directed toward several key initiatives aimed at addressing the opioid crisis within our community. A significant portion of the funds (75% or reported expenditures) has been allocated towards salary and benefits of our employees who are focused on expanding outreach and prevention

efforts, with various community-wide events designed to educate the public on the dangers of opioid misuse and promote healthier behaviors. The employees have been actively working on these events as well as building up town hall meetings, where local residents, stakeholders, and experts come together to discuss the impact of the opioid crisis, share resources, and develop collaborative solutions for prevention and intervention. In collaboration with community-based organizations (CBOs), employee time has also focused on educating these groups about how to sign up for the state’s Naloxone distribution program. This effort has empowered local organizations to access and distribute life-saving Naloxone, further extending the reach of overdose prevention resources across the community. In further efforts to reach younger populations, the settlement funds have been used towards employees working on and executing an agreement with a media company specializing in youth outreach. This partnership focuses on engaging young people through tailored prevention programs that raise awareness about the risks of opioid use and provide resources for those in need of help. The collaboration emphasizes education, early intervention, and support for young individuals at risk of opioid misuse, contributing to long-term community resilience. Additionally, the funds have been used to purchase and distribute Narcan newspaper stands, which have been placed in high-traffic areas around the community. These stands provide free access to Narcan along with educational materials on overdose prevention. This initiative has played a critical role in making life-saving tools more readily available to the public and empowering individuals to take action in the event of an overdose. All time spent researching, purchase, setting up by employee was billed towards the settlement funds. Together, these initiatives form a comprehensive strategy that addresses the opioi
